To amend and reenact R.S. 30:2363(12) and 2369(E)(3), relative to hazardous materials information, preparedness, and response; to provide for definitions, terms, reporting requirements, and exemptions under the Right-to-Know Law; and to provide for related matters.

HOUSE BILL NO. 36— BY REPRESENTATIVES HUDSON AND JOHNS

AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 32:388(A), (E), and (F)(1), relative to oversize and overweight vehicles; to provide for penalties for failure to stop at stationary weight enforcement scales; to provide for certain exceptions; to provide relative to the disbursement of payments for various penalties; and to provide for related matters.

Reported favorably by the Committee on Transportation, Highways, and Public Works. The bill was read by title and recommitted to the Committee on Revenue and Fiscal Affairs.

If the used motor vehicle dealer has failed to deliver all necessary documentation as provided by Subsection A of this Section, the purchaser or the commission may send written notification by certified mail, return receipt requested, of such failure to the dealer. If the dealer fails to provide the requested documentation within forty-five days of the receipt of such notification, he shall be subject to the penalties provided in Subsection C of this Section or a suit for damages which may be filed by the purchaser as provided herein.

C. Notwithstanding any other penalties provided for in this Chapter, a used motor vehicle dealer who violates the provisions of this Section shall be required by the commission to refund all proceeds gained from the sale of the vehicle plus ten percent of the purchase price to the purchaser. Reasonable attorney fees and costs shall also be awarded to the purchaser.

D. In lieu of seeking a remedy from the commission, a purchaser who has not received all necessary documentation as required by Subsection A of this Section to effect a transfer of title of a used motor vehicle may file a suit for damages in the court of competent jurisdiction in the parish in which the purchaser resides or is domiciled, in the parish in which the sale of the used motor vehicle took place, or in the parish in which the principal operating office of the used motor vehicle dealer is located. If the purchaser prevails, the court shall award liquidated damages, which include all proceeds gained by the dealer from the sale of the vehicle, plus ten percent of the purchase price of the vehicle. In addition to any damages awarded, the court may also award reasonable attorney fees and costs.

E. The provisions of this Section shall not apply to the sale of recreational vehicles.

(3) The commission shall be charged with the duty of policing and enforcing the provisions of this section. Its duly appointed officers shall have authority to make arrests for violations of any of the provisions of this section, orders, decisions, rules and regulations of the commission, or any part or portion thereof, and to serve any notice, order or subpoena issued by any court, the commission, its secretary or any employee authorized to issue same, and to this end shall have full authority throughout the state. Such officers upon reasonable belief that any motor vehicle is being operated in violation of any provisions of this section shall be authorized to require the driver thereof to stop and exhibit the registration certificate issued for such vehicle, to submit to such officers for inspection any and all bills of lading, waybills, invoices or other evidences of the character of the lading being transported in such vehicle and to permit such officer to inspect the contents of such vehicle for the purpose of comparing same with bills of lading, waybills, invoices or other evidences of ownership or of transportation for compensation.

(4) It shall be the further duty of such enforcement officers to impound any books, papers, bills of lading, waybills, and invoices which would indicate the transportation service being performed is in violation of this section, subject to the further orders of the commission.
