On WMAs where Self Clearing Permits are required, all persons must obtain a WMA Self Clearing Permit from an Information Station. The check in portion must be completed **including the time of issuance of the permit** and put in a permit box before ~~each day's activity on the day of the~~ **engaging in an activity within the WMA. Each Self-Clearing Permit required for an activity shall be valid for a period not to exceed seventy-two hours from issuance of the permit.** The check out portion must be carried by each person while on the WMA and MUST be completed and put in a permit box ~~after each day's activity on the day of the~~ **upon conclusion of the holder's activity within the WMA.** Each person must leave the Vehicle Tag portion of his permit on the dashboard of the vehicle used to enter into the WMA in such a way that it can be easily read from outside of the vehicle. This must be done only when the vehicle is parked and left unattended on the WMA. In an ATV, boat or other type vehicle was used to enter the WMA, then the vehicle tag must be attached to that vehicle in such a manner that it can be readily seen and read. When mandatory deer checks are specified on WMAs, hunters must check deer at a check station. Call the appropriate region office for the location of the deer check station on these WMAs. (Self-Clearing Permits are not required for persons only traveling through the WMA provided that the most direct route is taken and no activities or stops take place.)"
