(b) The term phrase "sale at retail" does not include an isolated or occasional sale of tangible personal property by a person not engaged in such business.

(I) "Isolated or occasional sale" means the sale of tangible personal property by an individual if the property was originally bought by the individual or a member of the individual's family for the personal use of the individual or the individual's family, the individual is not required to be registered as a dealer under this Chapter, and the individual does not employ an auctioneer, broker, or factor to sell the property.

(II) The phrase "isolated or occasional sale" shall not include sales of aircraft, boats that are used for recreational purposes, mobile homes, or motor vehicles in this state of a class or type required to be registered, licensed, titled, or documented by this state or by the United States.
