



## **Sen. Donahue To Discuss Redistricting Before Special Session**

Mandeville, LA – Prior to the Special Session on redistricting, Senator Jack Donahue (R-11) will meet with constituents and join in a televised discussion to review results from the 2010 census and explain how the redistricting process will change political boundaries throughout Louisiana.

As a member of the Senate Committee on Senate and Governmental Affairs, Sen. Donahue will appear at the Fuhrmann Auditorium at the Greater Covington Center, 317 North Jefferson St, on Thursday, Feb. 17 at 10 a.m. Committee members will present current district maps with 2010 Census population figures for Congress, Louisiana House and Senate, Board of Elementary and Secondary Education, Public Service Commission, and Courts of Appeal districts.

Sen. Donahue will join Rep. Rick Gallot (D-11) on LPB’s “Louisiana Public Square” for a citizen roundtable discussion on the redistricting process in Louisiana. “Redistricting Louisiana” will air statewide on Friday, Feb. 23 at 7 p.m. on LPB.

The House and Senate will convene for a Special Session on March 30 at 5 p.m.
