BY REPRESENTATIVE PEARSON
AN ACT**

To amend and reenact R.S. 11:927(B), relative to the optional retirement plan for postsecondary education employees participating in the Teachers' Retirement System of Louisiana; to provide for minimum employer contributions; to provide for application of payments; to provide for an effective date; and to provide for related matters.

The bill was read by title and placed on the Calendar for a second reading.

**HOUSE BILL NO. 24—
BY REPRESENTATIVE PEARSON
AN ACT**

To amend and reenact R.S. 11:103(B)(3)(e)(ii)(aa) and (iv)(aa) and (E) and to repeal R.S. 11:103(B)(3)(e)(i)(bb), (ii)(bb), and (iv)(bb), relative to amortization schedules of the Municipal Police Employees' Retirement System; to provide relative to the duration of such schedules; to provide for the combination and reamortization of existing schedules as of a certain date; to provide relative to the calculation of employer contribution rates

for the system; to repeal outdated provisions; and to provide for related matters.
