





Environmental Quality Changes in Funding since FY10


Total Budget by Fiscal Year and Means of Finance (in \$ millions)

FY18 Recommended Means of Finance



Non-SGF Sources of Funding:

Non-State General Fund sources of funding for the Department of Environmental Quality are derived from Interagency Transfers, Fees and Self-generated Revenues, Statutory Dedications, and Federal Funds.

The **Interagency Transfers** are from GOHSEP for demolition and landfill oversight.

Fees and Self-generated Revenues are derived from the sale of regulations, manifest forms, photocopies, registration fees paid by the participants in seminars conducted by the department.

Statutory Dedications, which make up eighty-three percent of DEQ's total means of finance, are derived from the Environmental Trust Fund, Oil Spill Contingency Fund, Motor Fuels Underground Tank Fund, Waste Tire Management Fund, Hazardous Waste Site Cleanup Fund and the Clean Water State Revolving Fund.

Federal Funds are derived from grants issued by the Environmental Protection Agency, U.S. Department of Energy, and the U.S. Department of Defense.





FTEs, Authorized Positions, and Other Charges Positions




