FY16 Executive Budget

Schedule 19B — Special Schools and Commissions Agencies

- <u>19-653 Louisiana Schools for the Deaf and Visually Impaired (Baton Rouge)</u> Provides residential elementary and secondary educational services to: (1) 128 hearing impaired children whose hearing loss is such as to preclude their making normal progress in regular classrooms of the public schools; and (2) 65 visually impaired children 3-21 years of age.
- 19-655 Louisiana Special Education Center (Alexandria) Serves 38 developmentally delayed, mentally disabled and severely orthopedically challenged residential students ages 3 through 30 years.
- <u>19-657 Louisiana School for Math, Science and the Arts (Natchitoches)</u> Provides an advanced curriculum program in a residential setting for 308 academically- and artistically-motivated high school students from across the state. Also serves as a Course Choice provider to public high schools where such instruction is not otherwise available..
- <u>19-662 Louisiana Educational Television Authority (Baton Rouge)</u> Develops, operates and maintains a statewide system of six (6) broadcast facilities to deliver educational and cultural programming and related services to public television viewers.
- <u>19-666 Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (Baton Rouge)</u> Serves as the constitutionally created policy-making board responsible for the supervision and control of the public elementary and secondary schools and special schools under its jurisdiction.
- 19-673 New Orleans Center for the Creative Arts Provides intensive, pre-professional training to 632 high school students in creative writing, dance, music, theatre and visual arts. All students live within commuting distance of the New Orleans metropolitan area.



Major Non-SGF Sources of Funding:

Interagency Transfers

- DHH \$16 m in Medicaid funds for eligible students at LSDVI and LSEC.
- LDOE \$4 m in MFP funds for LSMSA and NOCCA.
- LDOE \$2 m in federal special education funds for students at LSDVI and LSEC.

Fees & Self-generated Revenues

- Fees received from non-governmental sources for utilizing LETA's tower facilities, equipment and services
 \$1.7 m.
- Donations for LETA from Friends of Louisiana Public Broadcasting - \$0.8 m.
- LSMSA room and board fees \$0.3 m.

Statutory Dedications

- La. Quality Education Support [8(g)] Fund [C] \$24 m for innovative and exemplary educational programs across the state.
- Education Excellence Fund [C] \$0.4 m for educational enhancements for Pre-K 12 students.
- Charter School Startup Loan Fund [S] \$0.2 m for nointerest loans for Types 1, 2 and 3 Charter Schools for initial start-up funding.




Significant FY16 Budget Issue in OTED – LSDVI:

 The FY 2015-2016 Executive Budget <u>reduces LSDVI's Auxiliary</u> <u>Program budget by \$12,500</u> to \$2,500 in Fees and Self-generated Revenues based on historical analysis.



Significant FY16 Budget Issue in OTED – LSEC:

The FY 2015-2016 Executive Budget provides an <u>increase</u> of \$100,005 in <u>Interagency Transfers</u> budget authority to receive additional funding from the Department of Education for the <u>Louisiana Assistive Technology Initiative (LATI)</u>. This funding provides for an additional <u>facilitator</u> and additional <u>training</u> resources for local school districts.





Significant FY16 Budget Issues in OTED – LETA:

- The FY 2014-2016 Executive Budget includes a <u>reduction of four (4)</u> <u>vacant</u> Authorized (Appropriated) Table of Organization Full-Time Equivalent (T.O. FTE) <u>positions</u> and associated funding of <u>\$382,721</u> of State General Fund (Direct).
- The FY 2015-2016 Executive Budget also includes a reduction of \$17,279 of State General Fund (Direct) for a reduction of student wages.
- Pursuant to R.S. 17:2507, LETA requested, but <u>did not have</u> <u>recommended, \$838,817</u> in State General Fund (Direct) for the <u>support of public radio and television stations not licensed to LETA.</u>



• The FY 2015-2016 Executive Budget includes a <u>reduction of \$16,300</u> in State General Fund (Direct) for <u>operational costs</u> based upon historical analysis and projected expenditures for next year.

Significant FY16 Budget Issues in OTED – NOCCA:

• The FY 2015-2016 Executive Budget includes a <u>net increase of</u> **\$153,104** in Interagency Transfers from the Minimum Foundation Program (MFP) due to the **growth of approximately 30 students** in the Academic Studio.
