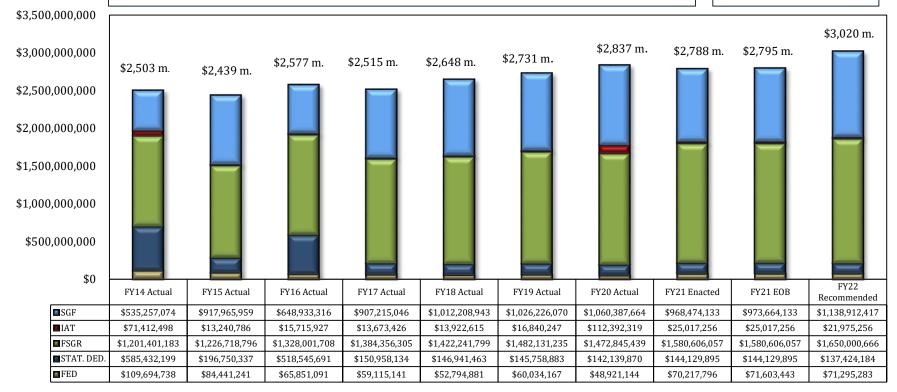

#### Total Actual/Budget by Fiscal Year and Means of Finance

#### **Interim Updates:**

Aug. 2020 – Carryforward BA-7 \$1.4M FED of GEAR UP Grant to low income students. Nov. 2020 – Supplemental Appropriation BA-7s for LSU research and instruction (\$4.99M SGF) and Delta Community College for renovation or construction (\$200,000 SGF).

Change from FY14 to FY22 is 21% Change from FY14 to FY20 is 13%

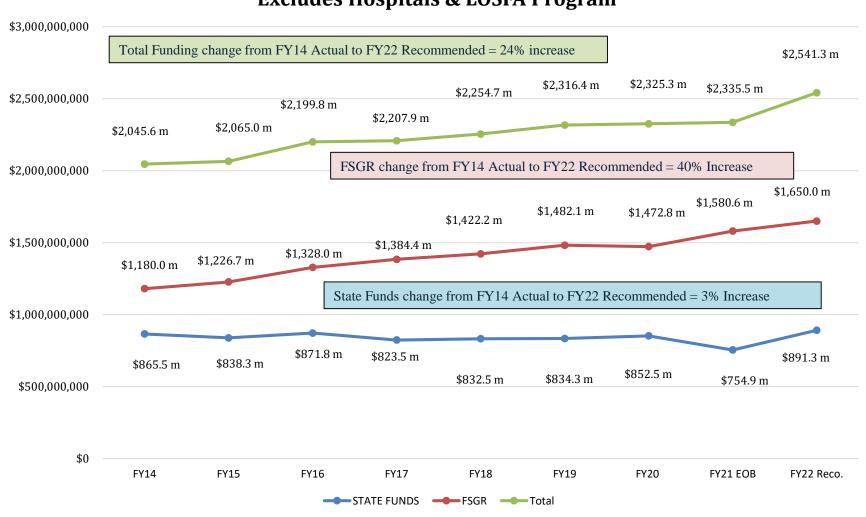

#### 19A-Higher Education Funding State Funds & FSGR Funding since FY14 Actuals

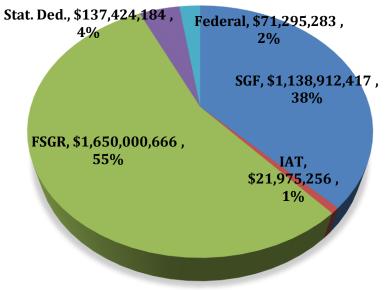

- TOPS Fund [C] \$56.3m for TOPS awards (\$1.1m less)
- Support Education in Louisiana First (SELF) Fund [S] \$35.9m for faculty salary and related benefits (\$1.2m less)
- LA Quality Education Support Fund [C] \$16.2m for research, endowment of scholars, enhancement of academic, research or agricultural departments, and graduate students recruitment(\$8.05m less)
- Higher Education Initiative Fund (HEIF) [S] \$4.28m for enhancement and instruction (\$4.1m more)
- Workforce Training Rapid Response Fund [S] \$10M for LCTCS workforce development (no change)

**Unrestricted funds** are resources eligible for any purpose in carrying out the mission, duties and responsibilities of the institution. These funds include state appropriations (SGF, dedicated funds), tuition and fees and other funds not restricted by a donor or grant. **The legislature appropriates unrestricted funds**.

**Restricted funds** are utilized for the operation and support of programs, but are restricted by donors, state or federal agencies as to the purposes for which these funds can be expended. These funds are traditionally referred to as "off budget."

**Restricted fund examples include:** student housing, dining services, student union, student health services, parking, athletics, faculty research, residence halls, etc.

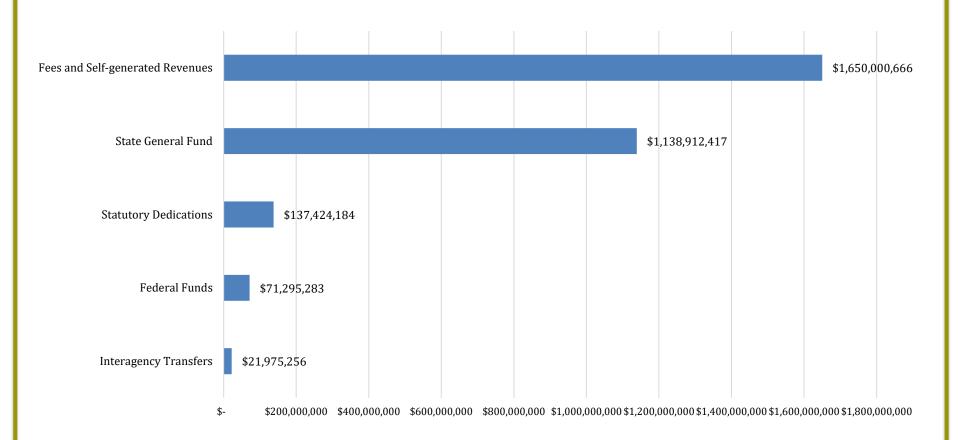

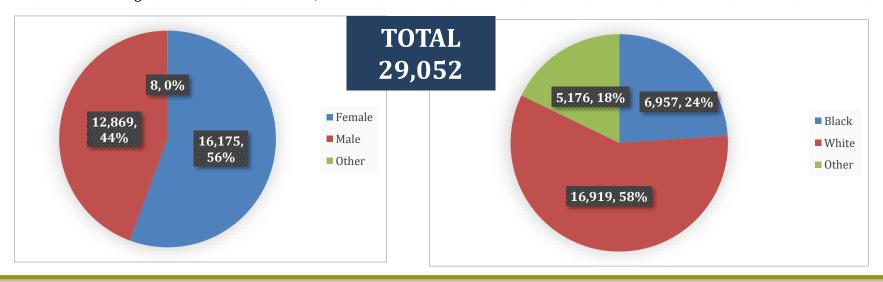

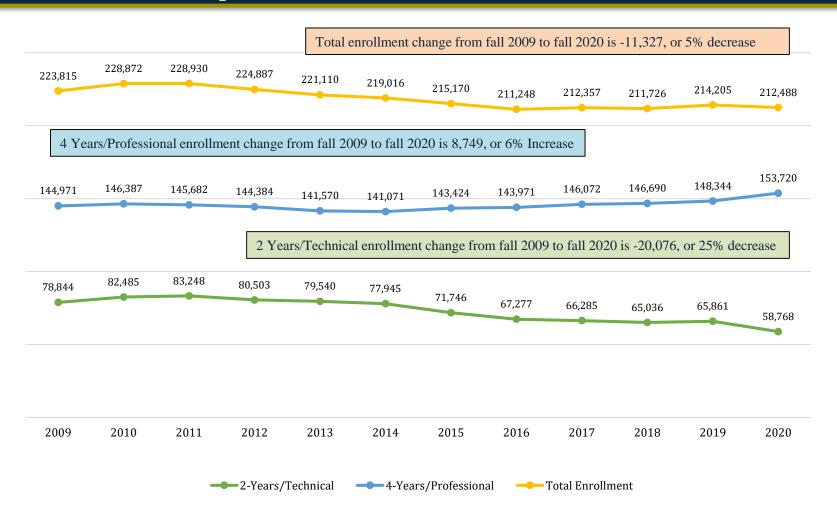

### The Louisiana Board of Regents

The Board of Regents, a state agency created by the 1974 Louisiana Constitution, coordinates all public higher education in Louisiana. The Board began operations January 1, 1975, succeeding the Coordinating Council for Higher Education.

The 15 volunteer members of the Board of Regents are appointed by the Governor to six-year, overlapping terms, with at least one (but not more than two) Regents drawn from each of Louisiana's six Congressional districts. In addition, the Louisiana Council of Student Body Presidents appoints one student member as its representative on the board.

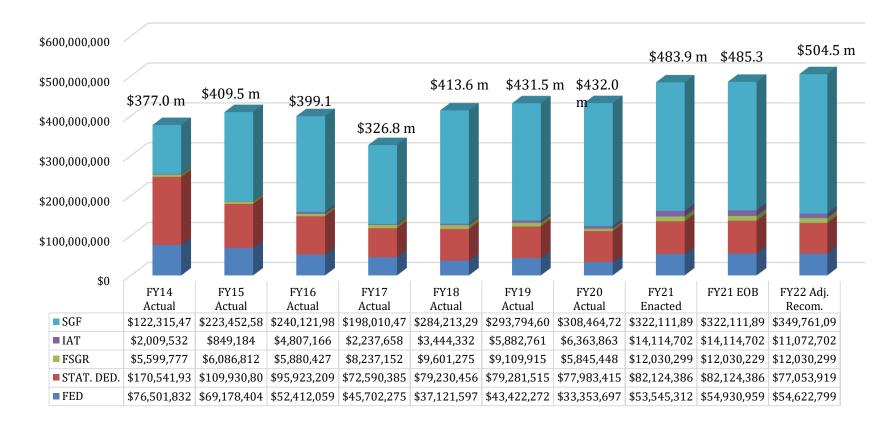
Policies and decisions of the Board of Regents are administered by a full-time staff headed by the Commissioner of Higher Education.

The Board of Regents has three programs: Administration, LOSFA and LUMCON.

Change from FY14 to FY20 is 15%, FY22 increase is \$19.2 m, including \$27.6 m SGF increase



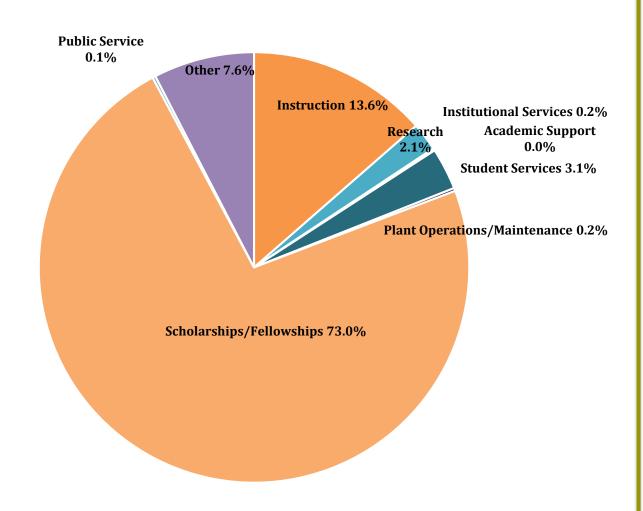

### 19A-671 Board of Regents Expenditures FY21 ENACTED BUDGET BY FUNCTION

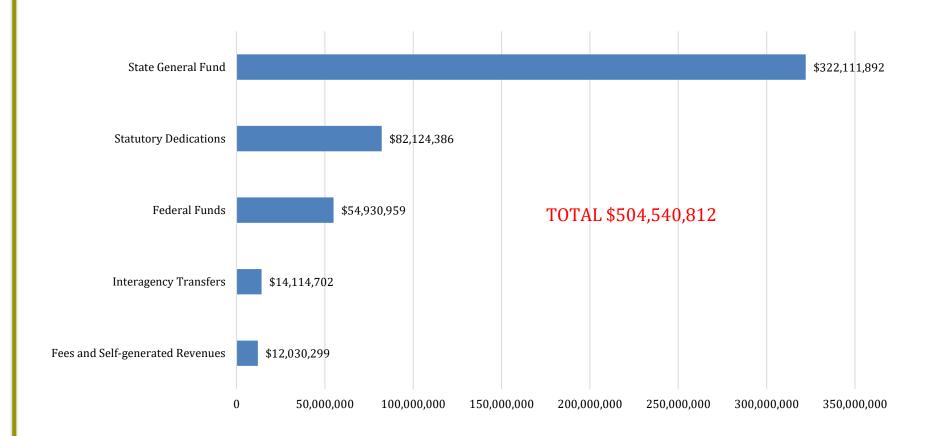

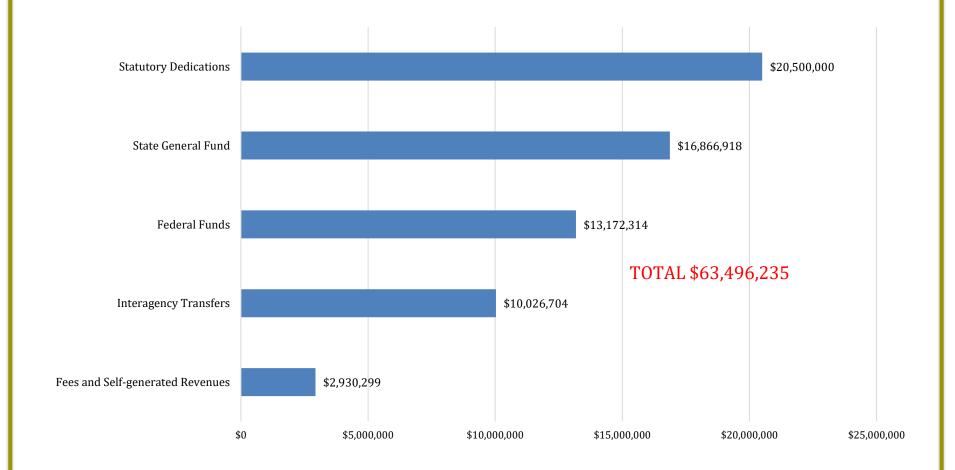
The responsibilities of the Board of Regents and those of the four management boards are carefully drawn to ensure a balance and distinction between coordinating, planning and policy-making, and management implementation. The 1974 Louisiana Constitution gives the Board of Regents the following authority:

- To review or eliminate existing degree programs or departments;
- To approve, disapprove, or modify proposed academic programs or departments;
- To study both the need for and feasibility of new post-secondary institutions as well as the conversion of existing schools into campuses offering more advanced courses of study;
- To formulate and update a master plan for higher education (which must include a higher education funding formula); and
- To review annual budget proposals for the operating and capital needs of each public institution prior to compilation of the Regents' higher education budget recommendations. The Board also recommends priorities for capital construction and improvements.

The Constitution provides that all duties and responsibilities not specifically vested in the Board of Regents be assigned to the respective management boards.

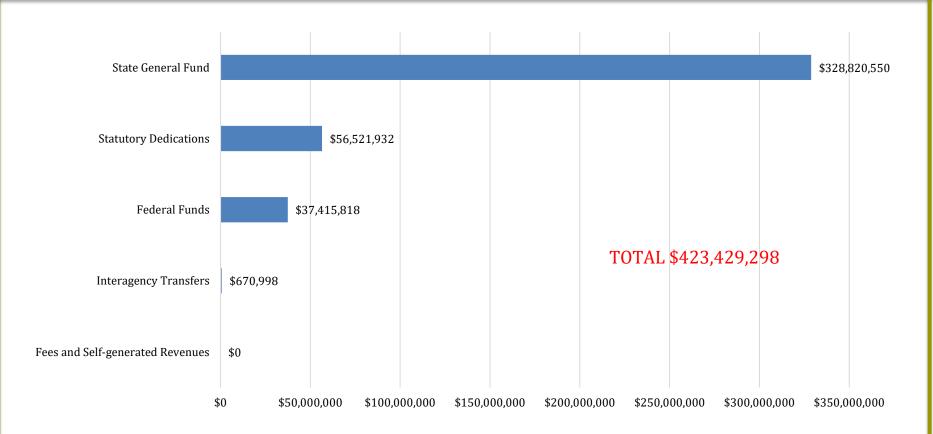

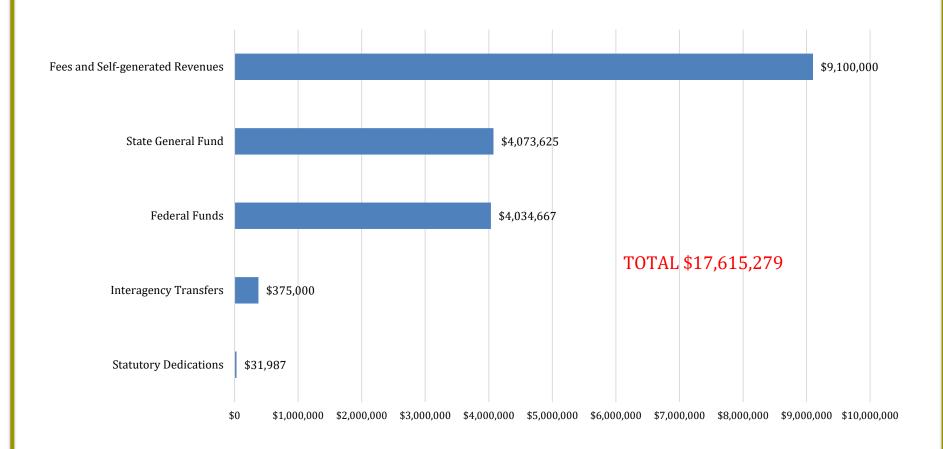

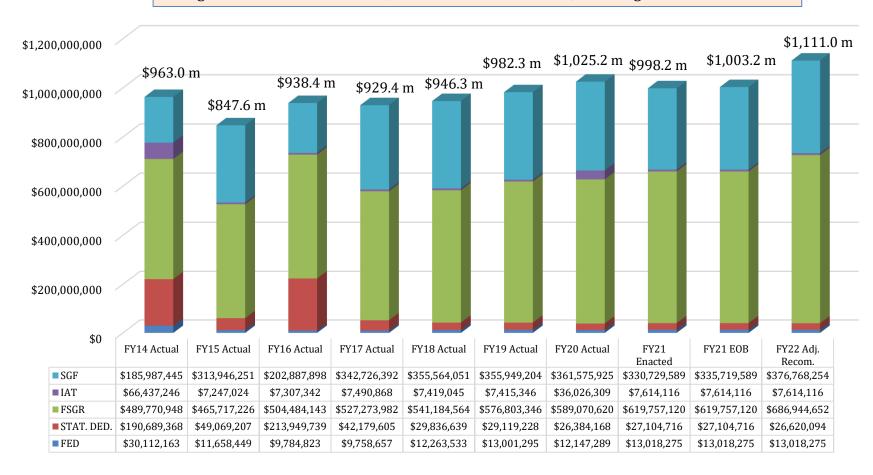

### 19A-600 LSU System Means of Financing FY14 to FY20 Actuals, FY21 & FY22 Recommended

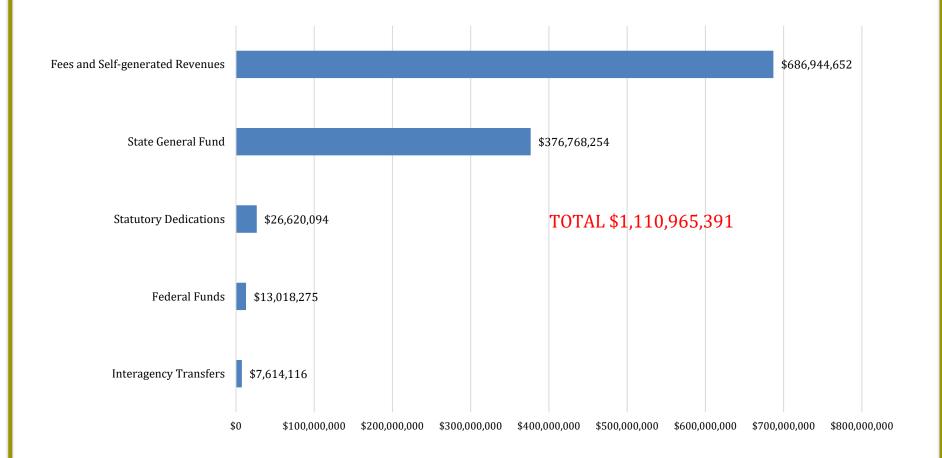

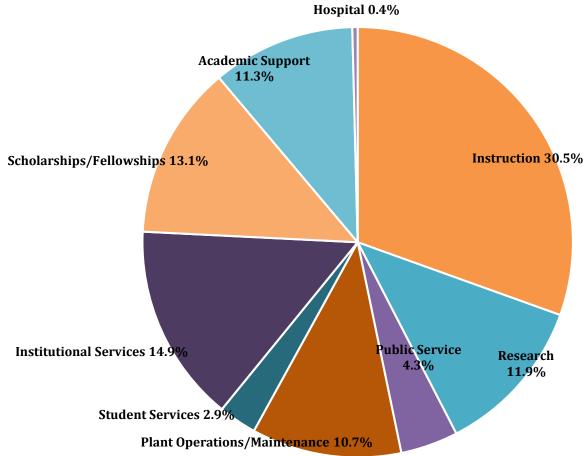

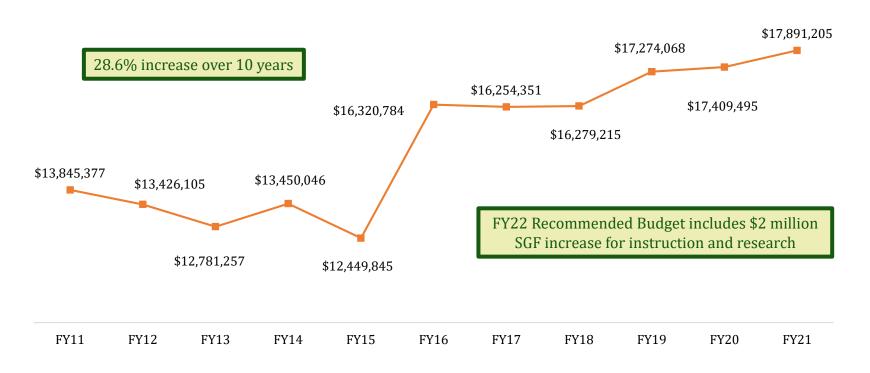

### Pennington Biomedical FY11 to FY21 State Funds (SGF/Dedications) ENACTED

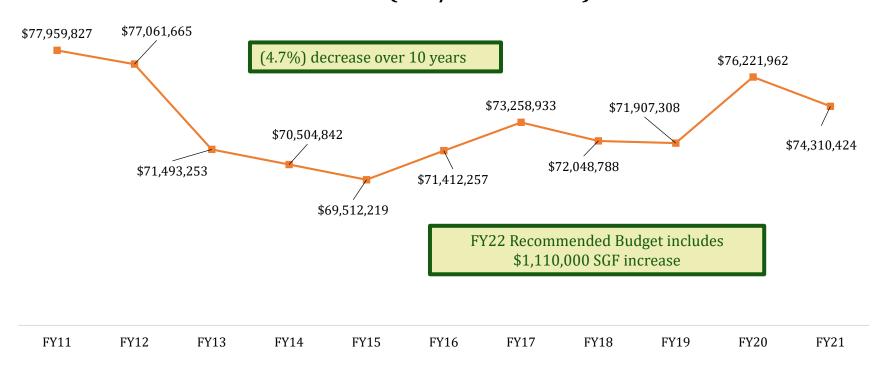

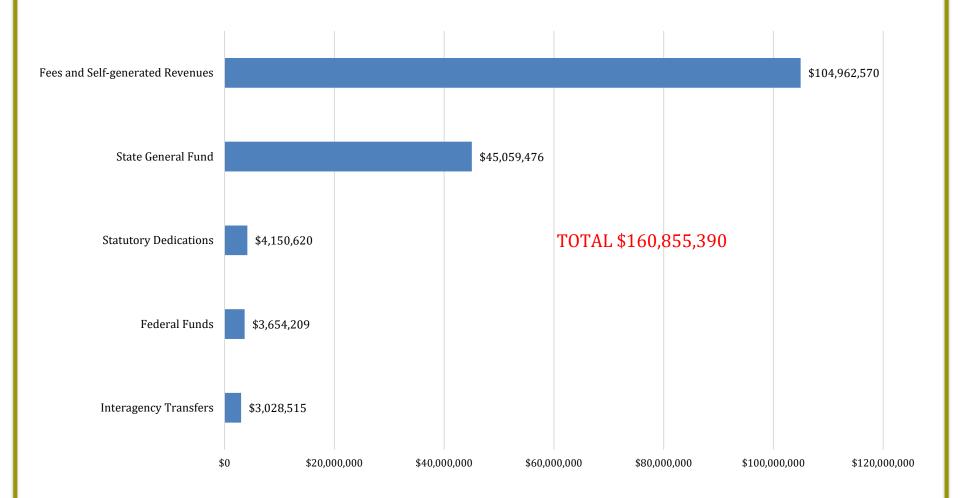

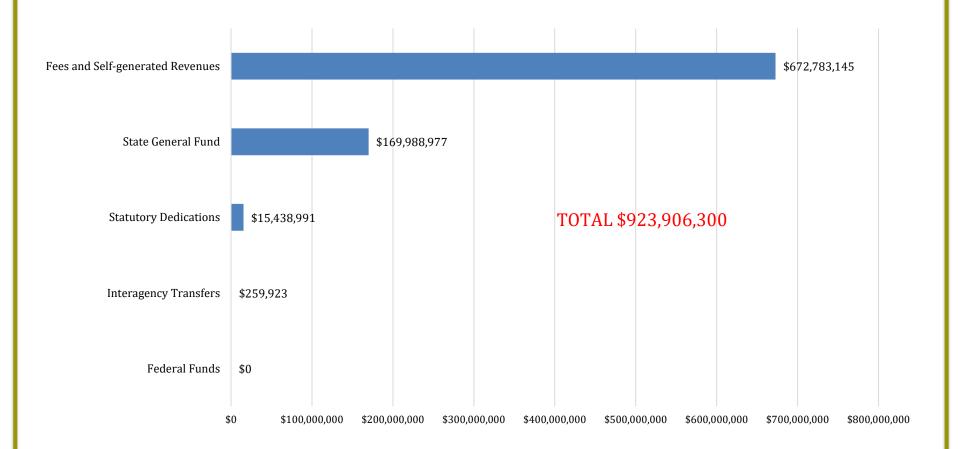

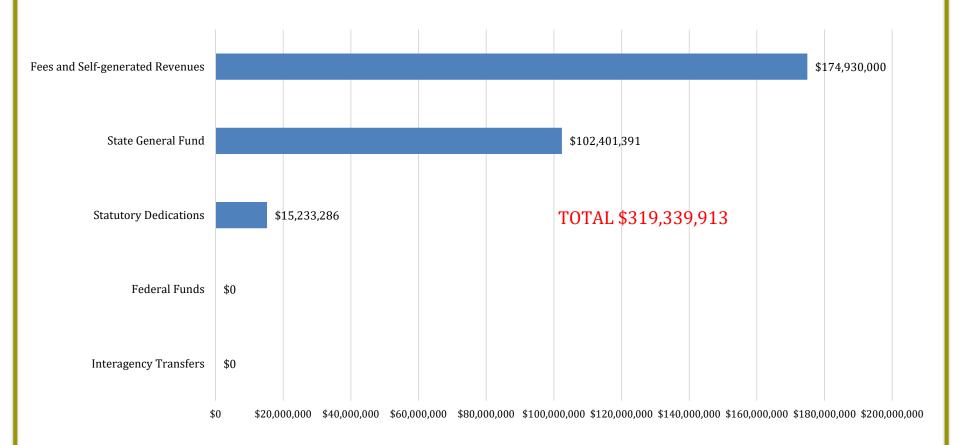

#### **GO GRANT**

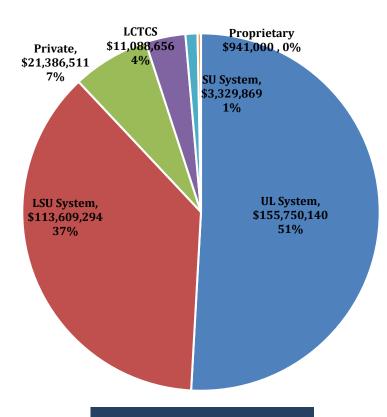

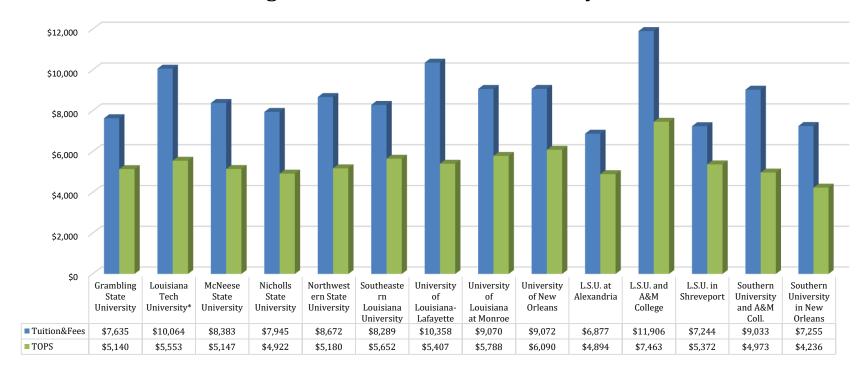

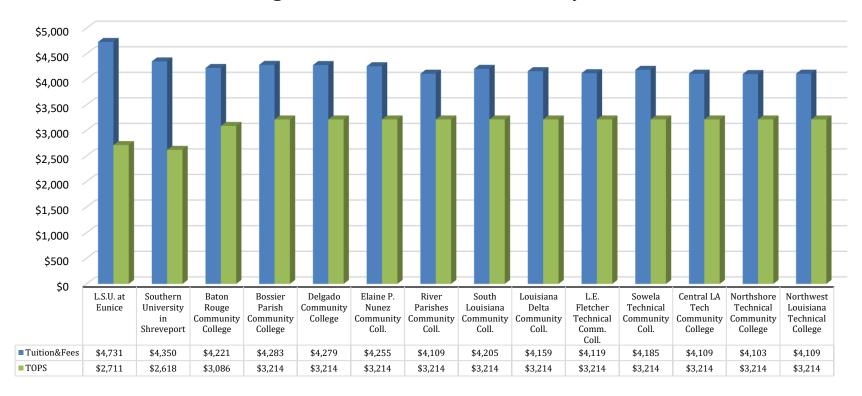

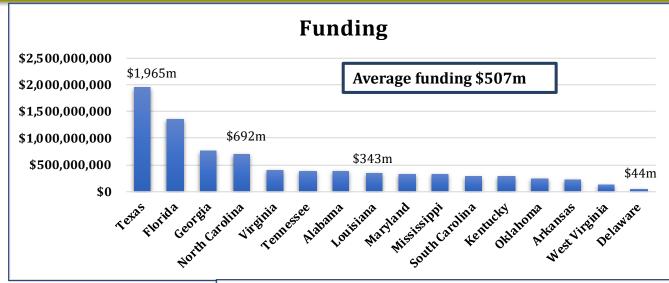

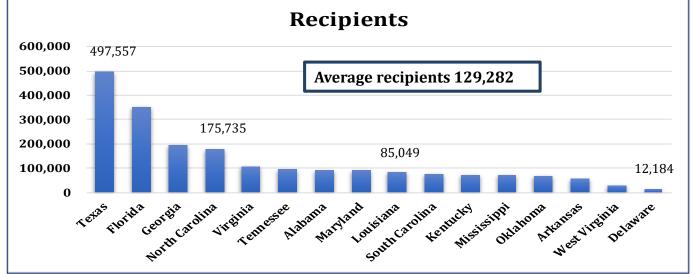


## 2017-18 Federal Pell Grant Allocation @ Public Institutions

# LOUISIANA HIGHER EDUCATION MASTER PLAN & FUNDING FORMULA



#### 19A-HIGHER EDUCATION MASTER PLAN

**Law** – R.S. 17:3128 states that the Board of Regents shall have the power to formulate and make timely revision of a master plan for postsecondary education. It requires the Board of Regents to review the Master Plan at least once every four years and revise as deemed necessary and appropriate.

**Louisiana Prospers: Driving Our Talent Imperative** – On August 28, 2019, the Board of Regents adopted a Master Plan for Higher Education that sets a strategic vision for the state and a robust attainment goal of 60% of working-age adults achieving a postsecondary education credential by the year 2030. Reaching that goal will require the state to more than double the number of credentials produced annually from 40,000 to more than 85,000 over the next 11 years.

**Impact on Formula Funding Distribution** – To increase attainment, promote adult education, and erasing equity gap, the Board of Regents changed the metrics of the outcomes portion of the funding distribution formula in FY20.

#### Major changes are:

- Pell Completer Weight: increases from 0.25 to 2.25.
- Adult Completer Weight: increases from 0.25 to 2.25.
- New Metric Weight: added 2.25 for Equity Gap Completer. Equity includes: American Indian/Alaskan Native, Black, Hispanic, Native Hawaii.
- Teacher and Nursing occupations are added to the 4 and 5 star jobs metrics.



#### 19A-HIGHER EDUCATION MASTER PLAN

**Master Plan Year One Review** – Included in the Board of Regents' 1<sup>st</sup> year master plan review report, there are addendums added that are related to HBCU designations, defining credentials of value and additional assessment metrics. These additions further advanced its vision in the master plan to erase equity gaps and increase adult completers.

**HBCU institutions (5)** – Grambling State University, Southern University and A&M College, Southern University Law Center, Southern University at New Orleans, and Southern University at Shreveport. The Southern University System is the only HBCU system in the nation.

**Quality Postsecondary Credentials of Value –** A certificate or industry-based certification will be considered and will be included in the Board's postsecondary attainment calculation.

**Goals** – To focus on ensuring equity and access to postsecondary and workforce opportunities. To acknowledge the impact that technical and industry-based education have on life trajectories across the state.

Includes 9 interactive attainment metrics, disaggregated by race/ethnicity, geography, and age range, that can be filtered by system and by institution type to track progress and inform decision making.

Prior to the Outcomes funding formula requirement of Act 462 of 2014, in FY15 and FY16 the Board of Regents did <u>not</u> use the funding formula to distribute the SGF. The Board of Regents distributed the SGF on a pro-rata share basis of the prior year's base budget.



FY22 distribution is based on the 2019 Master Plan. The Board of Regents decision relative to the funding distribution will not be finalized until the Board of Regents Board Meeting.

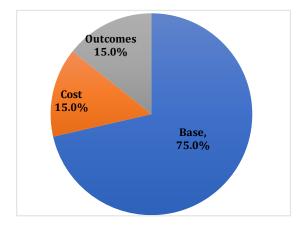
- Pursuant to Article VIII, Section 5(D)(4), one of the functions of the Board of Regents is to provide for a formula that <u>equitably distributes</u> funds to public institutions.
- Pursuant to <u>Act 462 of 2014 by Senator Appel</u>, the Board of Regents developed and implemented an outcomes based funding formula for 2-year/4-year institutions beginning in FY17.
- The current 2-year/4-year funding formula consists of 3 components:
  - COST: credit hours weighted by discipline, operation & maintenance, and general support.
  - OUTCOMES: student success including retention & completion, research and workforce alignment.
  - BASE LEVEL FUNDING: previous year allocation.



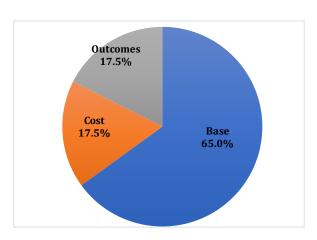
#### HIGHER EDUCATION FUNDING FORMULA

Due to provisions in Act 462 of 2014 that provide for the prevention of **dramatic changes** in funding from one institution to another while implementing the Outcomes Based Funding Formula, in FY17 (Year 1) the Board of Regents made a policy decision to weigh the various portions of the formula as follows: 70% - Base Funding, 15% - Cost Portion, and 15% - Outcomes Portion. The weights were adjusted in FY18, FY19 and FY20.

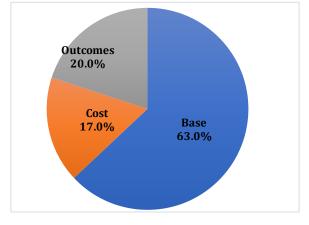

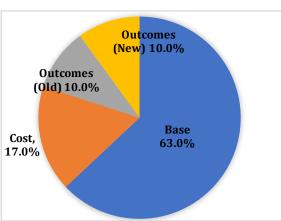

# LOUISIANA HIGHER EDUCATION RECENT LEGISLATION



#### **TOPS Tech & GO GRANT Awards Change**

Senate Concurrent Resolution 3 of the 2020 Second Extraordinary Legislative Session urges and requests that the Board of Regents study the feasibility of making TOPS Tech and Go Grant awards available to low-income students for use during the summer semester immediately following high school graduation.

#### **Board of Regents Report**

**TOPS Tech:** 1) The introduction of a need-based component to a merit-based program require legislative action to implement; 2) The eligibility cannot be determined until high school transcript is obtained in June, it's a challenge to enroll in summer school on time.

**Go Grant:** It is feasible only if the institution provides students with Pell Grants or financial needs grants during the summer session.

#### **Funding Impact**

**TOPS Tech:** TOPS has been fully funded for all but one of its 23 years. Funding levels for summer are contingent upon appropriation. Usage of TOPS Tech immediately following high school graduation would require dedicated/supplemental appropriation or the award would be issued on pro-rata basis, which will reduce the fall and spring semester awards.

**Go Grant:** Go Grant historically has been underfunded. To fully fund the eligible awards set by the individual colleges needs \$86 million based on 2020 packaging policy by institutions.



# Schedule 19A — Higher Education Work-based Learning Program

**Work-based Learning Program** – Senate Concurrent Resolution 42 of the 2019 Regular Legislative Session charges the Board of Regents, Department of Education, Louisiana Workforce Commission and Department of Economic Development jointly solicit and recommend a strategy and framework to the legislature and the governor for implementation of the work-based learning program.

- Fast Forward Initiative: A partnership between Board of Regents and Department of Education to prepare students for high-skill, high-wage and indemand occupations. It offers three pathways:
  - Jump Start 2.0
  - TOPS University
  - High Apprenticeship
- **LCTCS Programs:** Apprenticeships, Internships, Partnerships in healthcare, transportation, construction, and cybersecurity/business sectors.
- **Funding:** The Resolution requires recommendation of a funding model to support and sustain this program.



## Schedule 19A — Higher Education Autonomy

**GRAD ACT –** Louisiana Granting Resources And Autonomy For Diplomas Act (Act 741 of 2010 Regular Session)

- FY11 and FY12, increase tuition and mandatory fee up to 5% annually.
- FY13 and thereafter, increase tuition and mandatory fee up to 10% annually, until reach the average tuition and fee amounts of its peer institutions (SREB), with weighted median household income.
- Operational Autonomy: procurement, risk management, T.O. etc.

**Tuition Increases** – There are no tuition increases in FY21 and FY22. FY17 was the last year tuition increases under the LA GRAD Act.

**Fee Autonomy** – Act 293 of 2017 extended the sunset provision of higher education's fee autonomy to *June 30, 2020*. This fee autonomy has been in place for 5 fiscal years (FY16, FY17, FY18, FY19, FY20). No legislation passed to renew.



## Schedule 19A — Higher Education Autonomy

# **Operational Autonomy –** Act 36 of 2020 2<sup>nd</sup> Extraordinary Session removes the sunset date for the operational autonomy.

- 1). Authority to <u>retain any funds</u> which remain unexpended and unobligated at the end of the fiscal year for use at the institution's discretion. No later than **Oct.1** of each year each management board is to report to JLCB the amount of unexpended and unobligated funds retained by each institution by means of finance from the prior fiscal year.
- 2). Authority to <u>identify and dispose of obsolete equipment</u>, excluding vehicles and items considered by federal law to be of a dangerous nature.
- 3). Authority to be **excluded** by the division of administration from any **table of organization**.
- 4).\* Authority to participate in the <u>higher education procurement code</u> as established by Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College and approved by the division of administration.
- 5).\* **Exemption** from participation in the state's **risk management** program.
- \* Requires JLCB approval



### Schedule 19A — Higher Education Dual Enrollment

#### **SREB:**

Since September 2019, the Southern Regional Education Board (SREB) has launched a multi-year initiative to help states address growing concerns about dual enrollment, including cost and equity. It will help states meet their educational attainment and workforce goals.

#### Louisiana:

Universal Access to College in High School – The dual enrollment Task Force, a group created through Act 128 of the 2019 Legislative Session, adopted recommendations on Feb. 19, 2020 that call for universal access to college coursework for all high school students, designed to significantly increase future early college opportunities statewide.

**Students Served** – For Academic Year 2018-2019, 26,378 students served through LA Public postsecondary institutions.



## Schedule 19A — Higher Education Dual Enrollment

**Appropriated Funding and Estimated Cost** – Louisiana funded dual enrollment from FY08 to FY12 through the Early Start Program with average annual appropriation of \$5M, from FY13 to now through the Supplemental Course Allocation Program with current appropriation of \$10M. The estimated cost is \$25M annually based on assumed eligibility.

**Source of Funding** – Other than the State Funds, the other potential funding sources include local school district contribution through MFP, Federal grants, and contributions from the family/students. Some funding is included in the FY22 Executive Budget through the Higher Education Initiative Fund.

Close the Equity Gaps in Dual Enrollment Participation\* - Average composite scores (ACT) for Black students were 16.3 in 2019-20 and 20.9 for white students. Black students make up 43% of Louisiana's public school population but only 27% of those taking classes in dual enrollment. Within schools offering dual enrollment, many have persistent inequities in student participation when viewed by race/ethnicity and income status. Regents staff has conducted a review of the dual enrollment policy prepandemic and in response to the cancellation of standardized tests and disruptions beyond students' control during the COVID-19 pandemic, Regents issued an interim policy for dual enrollment in April 2020. This policy allows for eligibility for academic dual enrollment with a 2.5 GPA and any assessment indicated in the policy OR a 2.5 GPA and a counselor's recommendation.

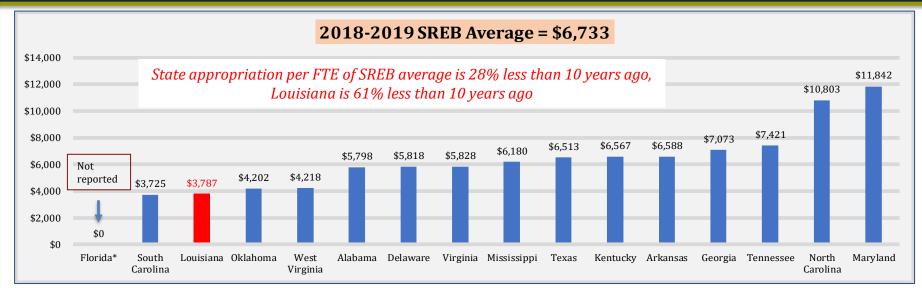

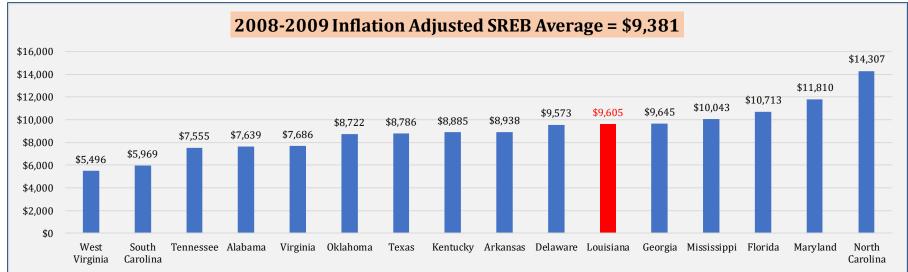
#### **4-Year Institutions Conclusions of Comparison**

- With adjustment for inflation on 2008-2009 data, the 2018-2019 SREB average on **Tuition & Fees Per FTE** is **32%** more than 10 years ago, Louisiana is **54%** more than 10 years ago.
- With adjustment for inflation on 2008-2009 data, the 2018-2019 SREB average on **Total Funding per FTE** is about the **same** as 10 years ago, Louisiana is **17%** less than 10 years ago.



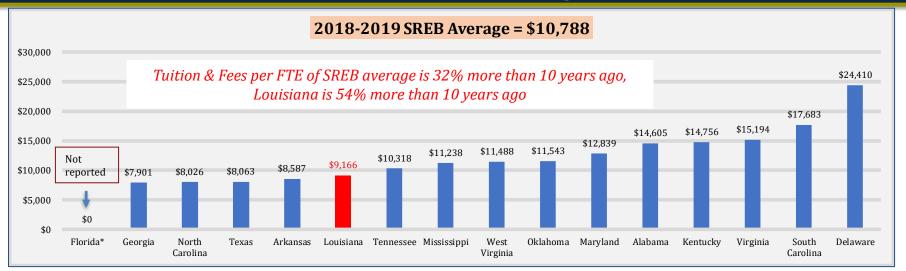
# 4-Year Institutions – State Appropriations Per FTE SREB Data Exchange

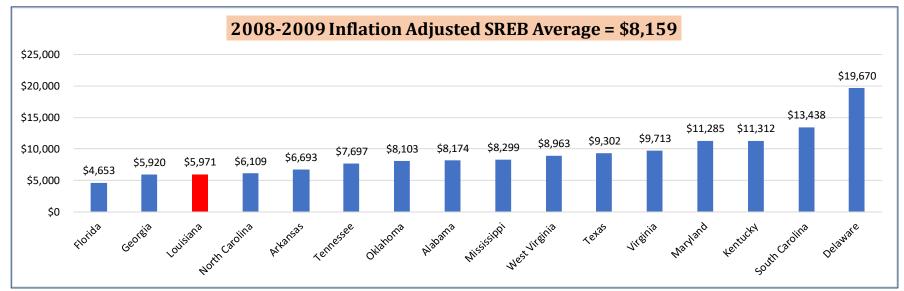






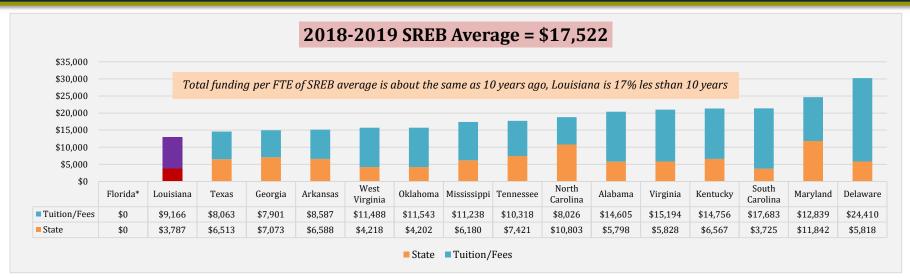
# 4-Year Institutions – Tuition & Fees Per FTE SREB Data Exchange

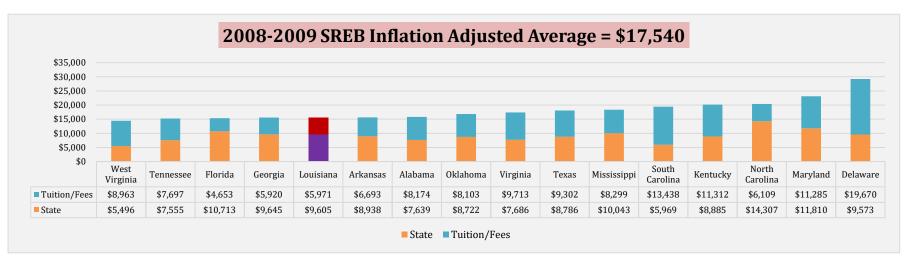






# 4-Year Institutions – Total Funding Per FTE SREB Data Exchange









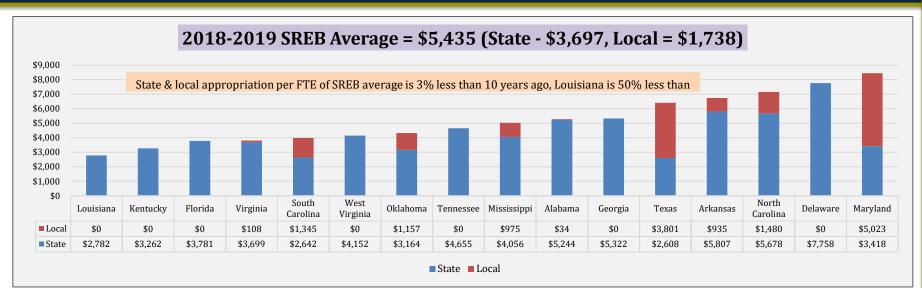

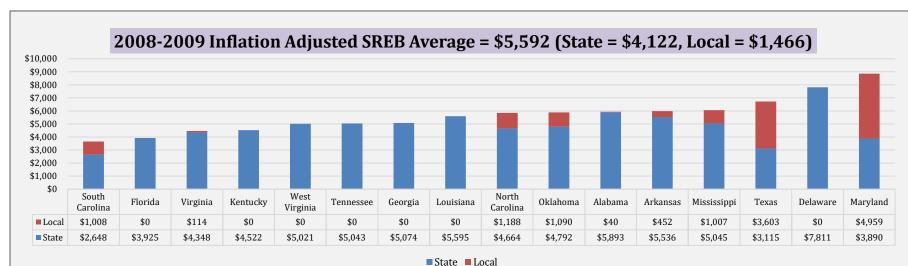
#### 2-Year Institutions Conclusions of Comparison

- With adjustment for inflation on 2008-2009 data, the 2018-2019 SREB average on <u>State & Local Appropriation Per FTE</u> is 3% less than 10 years ago, Louisiana is 50% less than 10 years ago.
- With adjustment for inflation on 2008-2009 data, the 2018-2019 SREB average on **Tuition & Fees Per FTE** is 9% more than 10 years ago, Louisiana is 34% more than 10 years ago.
- With adjustment for inflation on 2008-2009 data, the 2018-2019 SREB average on **Total Funding per FTE** is **1**% more than 10 years ago, Louisiana is **19**% less than 10 years ago.



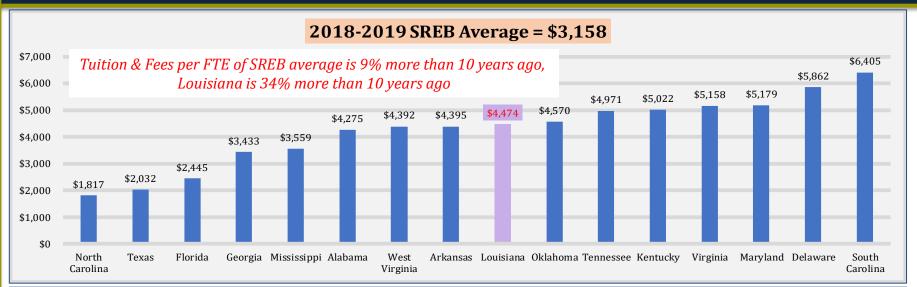
# 2-Year Institutions State & Local Appropriations Per FTE SREB Data Exchange

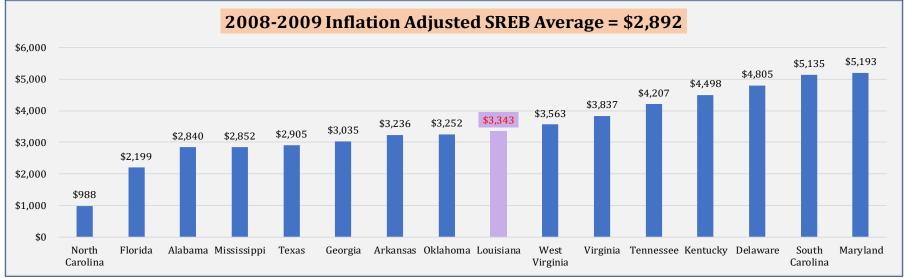






# 2-Year Institutions – Tuition & Fees Per FTE SREB Data Exchange

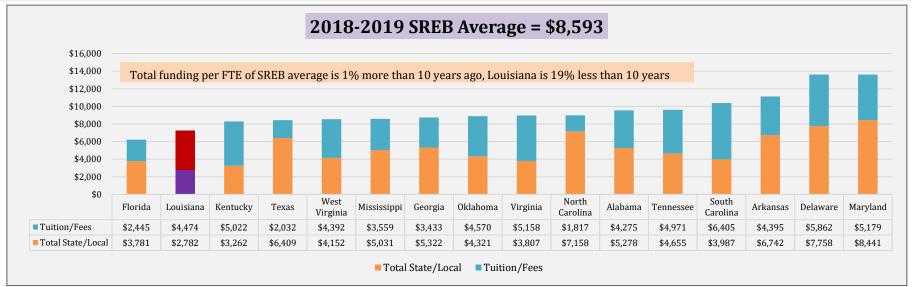


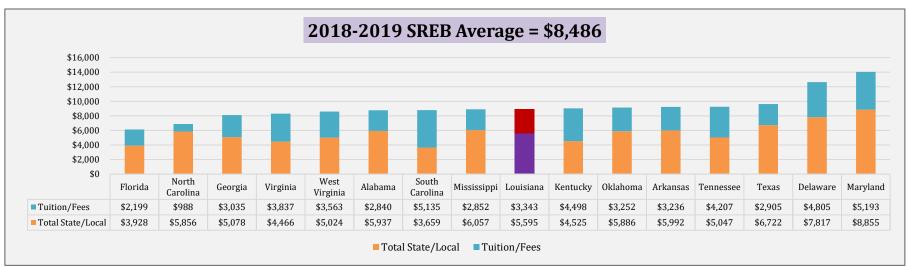




## 2-Year Institutions – Total Funding Per FTE

# LOUISIANA HIGHER EDUCATION AUDIT FINDING



#### South Louisiana Community College – Louisiana Community and Technical College System

January 22, 2020

SLCC may have violated state law when it granted employees one-time payments of 2 percent to 7 percent of each employee's gross salary. *Prior-year findings related to inadequate administration over the Federal Direct Student Loans Program and weaknesses over the computer system used to handle tuition, fees, and refunds were resolved. In addition, prior-year findings for South Central Louisiana Technical College related to functions assumed by SLCC were resolved.* 

#### **Southern University System**

February 5, 2020

For the *second consecutive year*, some staff members had inappropriate access to the electronic system for purchasing/accounts payable, payroll/human resources, and student accounts. In addition, the system's Office of the Internal Auditor issued an investigative audit report in May 2019 that identified issues related to the inappropriate use of leave and errors in processing payroll time and attendance. As a result, the system's internal auditor determined the associate vice chancellor for academic affairs at Southern University of New Orleans owed the university \$43,144.



#### **Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center - Shreveport**

February 26, 2020

For the *second consecutive year*, the center did not have adequate controls in place over state and private grants and contracts to pursue collection of monies owed to it. In addition, the center inaccurately classified net position from several contracts totaling more than \$78 million, which led to a net overstatement of restricted expendable net position and a net understatement of unrestricted net position. The center also did not ensure compliance with federal requirements for documentation of compensation of personnel services or for Special Tests and Provisions.

#### Southeastern Louisiana University - University of Louisiana System

March 18, 2020

Southeastern did not have a process in place to determine if students were eligible to receive student financial assistance. As a result, 94 students with subsidized and unsubsidized loans were allowed to borrow \$552,647 in excess of the aggregate loan limits for Federal Direct Student Loans. In addition, some of the students incorrectly received payments totaling \$34,123 in Federal Pell Grants and \$3,000 in Federal Perkins Loans. Southeastern also did not accurately report construction costs for the Computer Science and Technology building as of June 30, 2018, which caused an \$18.6 million overstatement and required an adjustment of the prior-year's financial statement to correct capital assets. Southeastern also submitted inaccurate information regarding the Federal Direct Student Loans program in the Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards for the 2019 fiscal year and overstated the balance for Federal Perkins Loans – Federal Capital Contributions.

**Louisiana State University and Related Campuses – Louisiana State University System** March 19, 2020

For the second consecutive year, LSU A&M did not have adequate controls in place to ensure it complied with Special Tests and Provisions requirements for federal awards. In addition, for the third consecutive year, the LSU Agricultural Center did not have adequate controls over Special Tests and Provisions requirements. LSU and Related Campuses, which includes LSU, the AgCenter, and Pennington Biomedical Research Center, did not ensure they complied with federal procurement requirements for fiscal year 2019. LSU and Related Campuses also did not have formal written policies in place over administrative allowances totaling approximately \$4.9 million as of January 1, 2019. Administrative allowances are given as additional salary to employees for extra duties outside the scope of their normal job duties. Prior-year findings related to noncompliance with federal equipment management regulations at PBRC, non-compliance and weakness in controls over federal reporting requirements at the AgCenter and PBRC, weakness in controls over federal Research and Development Cluster expenses at the AgCenter, failure to fulfill employment obligations, and internal audit findings at the University Laboratory School were resolved.



#### **Louisiana Board of Regents**

April 29, 2020

The Louisiana Office of Student Financial Assistance, which is a program of the Board of Regents, did not ensure employees' time sheets were approved in a timely manner. In addition, the board, including LOSFA and the Louisiana Universities Marine Consortium for Research and Education (LUMCON), did not adequately monitor LaCarte card and Controlled Billed Account purchases, which resulted in unauthorized and inadequately supported purchases. *Prior-year findings related to inadequate controls over the Schedule of Expenditures of Federal Awards, weakness in controls over federal cash management requirements and federal reporting requirements, and inaccurate preparation of the Annual Fiscal Report were resolved. A previous finding for LUMCON related to inadequate controls over accounts receivable also was resolved.* 

# **Louisiana State University at Shreveport – Louisiana State University System** July 29, 2020

For the *second consecutive report*, LSUS did not have adequate controls in place over outstanding student account balances. As of January 31, 2020, the amount owed by students totaled approximately \$2.4 million. In addition, as of March 17, 2020, LSUS had not completed monthly bank reconciliations for the months of July 2018 through February 2020. The university also did not have adequate controls over payroll processing and may have violated state law when it paid employees a one-time salary supplement in fiscal year 2019.



#### River Parishes Community College – Louisiana Community and Technical College System

August 5, 2020

For the *second consecutive report*, RPCC did not have adequate controls in place to manage outstanding student account balances, allowing students who owed money to register for classes and failing to send notices to students and delinquent accounts to the state Office of Debt Recovery or to write off student-related account balances. In addition, for the second consecutive report, RPCC did not have adequate controls over the assessment of student tuition and fees. Sixteen students were undercharged for a course, and tuition and fee waivers were not applied to dual-enrolled students' accounts. Also, for the *second consecutive report*, RPCC was found to have problems with bank reconciliations. Reconciliations for July 2019 through March 2020 did not balance, with differences between bank balances and the general ledger ranging from \$1.46 million to negative \$1.31 million. *A previous report finding related to inadequate controls over the electronic administrative system was resolved*.



# **Louisiana State University at Eunice – Louisiana State University System** August 19, 2020

The university failed to reconcile \$2.6 million in student payment plan transactions processed by a third-party organization between bank deposits and amounts posted to the student accounts. In addition, the university had inadequate controls over student refunds and did not have adequate controls over cash receipts. The university also did not submit past-due student accounts to the Louisiana Attorney General for collection in accordance with state law and its written procedures. The university's unclassified employees who earn leave did not certify time and attendance records as required by state law, and the university did not have an incident response plan in place at the time of a ransomware attack in October 2019.

# Northshore Technical Community College - Louisiana Community and Technical College System

October 30, 2020

The college failed to enter 371 items for the Lacombe and Livingston campuses into the state property system in a timely manner. The items, which totaled \$805,297, were recorded from eight to 273 days past the required 60-day period.



#### Louisiana Delta Community College – Louisiana Community and Technical College System

November 25, 2020

LDCC did not have adequate control over its electronic accounting system. For the *third consecutive report*, employee access to the system was not removed in a timely manner after separation. For the *second consecutive report*, student fee tables were not accurately set up in the accounting system for online and high school students. In addition, during fiscal year 2020, LDCC did not provide evidence of reconciliation of the data in the system's accounts receivable and finance modules, and expense-related items were entered and processed through the system by the same employee without an independent review. *Prior-report findings related to inadequate controls over outstanding student account balances and chancellor waivers not in accordance with system policy were resolved.* 

# **Louisiana State University Health Sciences Center - Health Care Services Division** December 9, 2020

The Health Care Services Division did not maintain sufficient evidence to support that internal controls relating to financial reporting were implemented. Two monthly bank reconciliations were not reviewed in a timely manner; reviewers' approvals occurred 58 days and 125 days after the bank statement date.



#### **Louisiana Community and Technical College System**

December 23, 2020

The system did not have adequate controls over financial reporting and failed to notify the Legislative Auditor and the parish district attorney of certain suspected misappropriations as required by law.
