B.(1)(a) Notwithstanding any other law to the contrary, upon implementation of the Unified Carrier Registration Act of 2005, 49 U.S.C.A. §14504(a), by its board of directors and the secretary of the Department of Transportation of the United States, the Department of Public Safety and Corrections shall be the state agency which shall administer the Unified Carrier Registration Agreement through its office of motor vehicles, office of state police, and such other offices,

sections, or divisions as the secretary deems necessary, in accordance with the rules and regulations promulgated by the board of directors of the Unified Carrier Registration Plan, all as provided for in the Unified Carrier Registration Act of 2005, 49 U.S.C. A. §14504(a). The department shall be identified to the Secretary of the United States Department of Transportation as such state agent which has the legal authority, resources, and qualified personnel necessary to administer such Act and such rules and regulations as provided for in 49 U.S.C.A. §14504a(e)(1)(A).

(b) For the first twelve months after the implementation of the Unified Carrier Registration Act by its board of directors and the secretary of the Department of Transportation of the United States, the Department of Public Safety and Corrections shall be assisted by the Public Service Commission in the development of a program for the administration of the provisions of the Act and its rules and

regulations.
(2)(a) The department's administration of the Unified Carrier Registration Act shall be assisted by the office of weights and standards stationary scales police force of the Department of Transportation and Development, which is hereby authorized upon implementation of the Unified Carrier Registration Act by its board of directors and the secretary of the Department of Transportation of the United States, to issue tickets at the weight enforcement stationary scales for violations of the provisions of that Act and provisions of this Section, and rules or regulations issued thereunder. The procedures for issuance and processing of such tickets shall be provided by rules and regulations promulgated by the Department of Transportation and Development in accordance with the provisions of the Administrative Procedure Act.

(b) The provisions of this Section shall not be construed to delete or limit the administrative or enforcement authority of the Department of Transportation and Development as provided for in

other laws.

C.(1) All fees required by the Unified Carrier Registration Agreement shall be paid to the Department of Public Safety and Corrections, and after complying with the provisions of the Unified Carrier Registration Agreement, all revenue derived by the state from such Agreement shall be received by the department and shall be deposited upon receipt into the state treasury

(2)(a) Out of the funds remaining in the Bond Security and Redemption Fund after a sufficient amount is allocated from that fund to pay all obligations secured by the full faith and credit of the state that become due and payable during a fiscal year as provided for in Article VII, Section 9(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana, the treasurer shall each fiscal year deposit into a special fund hereby created in the state treasury, to be known as the Unified Carrier Registration Agreement Fund, an amount equal to the total amount received by the treasurer pursuant to Paragraph (1) of this Subsection.

(b) All unexpended and unencumbered money in the fund at the end of a fiscal year shall remain in the fund and shall be available for use in the next fiscal year as provided for in this Subsection. Money in the fund shall be invested as provided by law, and any interest earned on such investments shall be credited to the fund after compliance with the provisions of Article VII, Section 9(B) of the

Constitution of Louisiana.
