(ii) Any determination to be made by the secretary as provided for in this Subparagraph and in R.S. 47:287.85(C)(2) shall be made in accordance with rules and regulations promulgated by the secretary and approved by the Senate Revenue and Fiscal Affairs Committee and the House Committee on Ways and Means meeting jointly.'
