RE: Select Committee on Hurricane Recovery

Dear Mr. Koepp:

Pursuant to Senate Rule 13.20, I hereby create the Senate Select Committee on Hurricane Recovery. The committee will review issues related to hurricane recovery, including, but not limited to, acting as an oversight committee to handle the sunset of the Louisiana Recovery Authority. Additionally, the Speaker of the House of Representatives is also creating a Select Committee on Hurricane Recovery. These two committees will function as the Joint Select Committee on Hurricane Recovery, and shall have the same powers, duties, and authorities as standing committees meeting jointly pursuant to Senate Rule 13.12, and House Rule 14.6. We look to this joint committee to provide the Senate and House with recommendations and direction concerning hurricane policies to speed the recovery in all affected areas of the state.

The joint committee will be composed of five members of the Senate and five members of the House of Representatives. A quorum of the joint committee shall consist of a majority of the total membership. Any action taken by the joint committee shall be upon the favorable vote of a majority of the members from each house present and voting, each house voting separately, a quorum of the joint committee being present.

The chairmanship of the joint committee will rotate between the Senate and the House of Representatives on an annual basis. Representative Abramson will serve as the initial chair of the joint committee. After one year, the chair will become Senator Peterson.

Enclosed is a list of the members of the Senate Select Committee on Hurricane Recovery. In addition, the committee will be staffed by Bob Barbor, who has been contracted by the Legislative Budgetary Control Council to handle hurricane recovery issues.

Please take appropriate action under the Senate Rules regarding notifications and recordation of this action.

Proposing to amend Article VII, Section 10.3(C) of the Constitution of Louisiana, relative to the Budget Stabilization Fund; to provide for incorporation of monies in the Budget Stabilization Fund into the official forecast for the current fiscal year and the next fiscal year; to direct the treasurer to transfer monies from the Budget Stabilization Fund to the state general fund in certain circumstances; to suspend deposits into the Budget Stabilization Fund in certain circumstances; and to specify an election for submission of the proposition to electors; and provide a ballot proposition.
