(1) The prescribing physician can demonstrate, based on sound clinical evidence, that the preferred treatment required under step therapy or fail first protocol has been ineffective in the treatment of the insured's disease or medical condition.
(2) The prescribing physician can demonstrate, based on sound clinical evidence, that the preferred treatment required under the step therapy or fail first protocol is expected to be ineffective based on the known relevant physical or mental characteristics of the insured and known characteristics of the drug regimen.
(3) The prescribing physician can demonstrate, based on sound clinical evidence, that the preferred treatment required under the step therapy or fail first protocol will cause or will likely cause an adverse reaction or other physical harm to the insured.
C. The duration of any step therapy or fail first protocol shall not be longer than the customary period for the medication when such treatment is deemed clinically ineffective by the prescribing physician. When the preseribing physician health coverage plan can demonstrate, through sound clinical evidence, that the originally prescribed medication is likely to require more than the customary

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period for such medication to provide any relief or an amelioration to the insured, the step therapy or fail first protocol may be extended for a period of time to be determined by the physician."
