HOUSE BILL NO. 25— BY REPRESENTATIVE HENRY BURNS AN ACT

To enact R.S. 37:2156.1(N), relative to certain state contractors' licenses; to provide for an exemption from certain examination requirements for licensed arborists; and to provide for related matters.

The bill was read by title and placed on the Calendar for a second reading.

HOUSE BILL NO. 126— BY REPRESENTATIVES DIXON AND BROADWATER AN ACT

To enact R.S. 23:1203.1(O) and 1294(C), relative to the Workers' Compensation; to provide for immunity from legal proceedings to the Medical Advisory Council; to provide for immunity from legal proceedings to the Workers' Compensation Advisory Council; to provide with respect to subpoenas; and to provide for related matters.

§2862. Definitions

The following terms shall have the following meanings, unless otherwise specified:

(7) "Individual-in-training" means an individual who enters the field of polysomnographic technology after January 1, 2006, who must work under the direction and supervision of a registered polysomnographic technologist or the medical director of a sleep center or laboratory and is working towards BRPT registry or completion of a CAAHEP accredited program in polysomnography; or both. This Paragraph shall be null and cease to have effect after January 1, 2011.

(8) (7) "Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners" means that organization agency established in R.S. 37:1263.

(9) (8) "Physician" means an individual licensed by the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners.

(10) (9) "Polysomnography" means the performance of sleep diagnostics under the direction and supervision of a physician to provide comprehensive clinical evaluation.

(11) (10) "Polysomnographic technician" or "permit technician" means a registry eligible allied health professional who has completed an accredited CAAHEP educational program in polysomnography.

(12) (11) "Polysomnographic technologist" or "technologist" means an allied health professional who is credentialed by the Board of Polysomnographic Technologists to perform both diagnostic and therapeutic polysomnograms under the direction and supervision of a physician holds a license to practice polysomnographic technology issued by the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners.

(13) (12) "Polysomnographic technology" means the allied health specialty practiced under the direction and supervision of a physician involving the attended monitoring and testing of individuals suffering from any sleep disorders as classified in the International Classification of Sleep Disorders. Such procedures include but are not limited to the following, conducted only upon written prescription or verbal order of a physician and under his direction and supervision:

(a) Application of electrodes and apparatus necessary to monitor and evaluate sleep disturbances, including application of devices which allow a physician to diagnose sleep disorders, which disorders include sleep breathing disorders, movement disorders, disorders of excessive somnolence, and physiologic impotence.

(b) Institution of any type of physiologic monitoring applicable to polysomnography.

(c) Initiation of treatment changes and testing techniques required for the implementation of polysomnographic protocols under the supervision and direction of a physician.

* * *

§2864. Advisory Committee on Polysomnography; creation

* * *

C. Three members shall serve an initial term of one year; three shall serve an initial term of two years; and all others shall serve an initial term of three years as determined by lot conducted at the first meeting of the board. After the initial terms have expired, members shall serve for three-year terms.

D. A majority of the members of the committee shall elect a chairman.

E. The committee shall meet no less than quarterly annually at a time and place to be determined by the chairman of the committee. A majority of the members of the committee shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of all business.

F. Each member shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for travel expenses incurred during attendance at meetings of the committee and other expenses incurred on business of the committee. Such compensation shall be paid from funds derived from fees as provided in R.S. 37:2868.

§2865. Technologist; qualifications for license; renewal; reciprocity; title

A. In order to obtain a polysomnographic technologist license, an applicant shall demonstrate all of the following to the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners:

(1) He The applicant is of good moral character.

(2) He The applicant has current credentials as a registered polysomnographic technologist granted by the Board of Registered Polysomnographic Technologists or equivalent organization and approved by the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners.

(3) After July 1, 2017, the following requirements shall also be met:

(a) The applicant has graduated from a CAAHEP accredited program.

(b) The applicant has taken an examination that is administered as a component of a certification program that is accredited by the National Commission for Certifying Agencies, the American National Standards Institute, or other national accrediting organizations approved by the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners.

(4) The applicant satisfies such other procedures and requirements as the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners may require.

C. A polysomnographic technologist who submits a license renewal application after January 1, 2006, shall have completed, in the prior twelve months, at least ten hours or units of continuing education courses sanctioned by the Advisory Committee on Polysomnography and approved by the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners.

E. A license shall entitle the individual to use the title "polysomnographic technologist", "technologist", or "permit technician", or the initials "PSGT".

§2866. Technicians; qualifications for permit; renewal

A. The Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners may issue a permit to an individual to practice as a polysomnographic technician who has applied for the BRPT examination. The permit shall be valid for twelve months until the date on which the results of the qualifying examination are known and acted upon by the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners.

C. The permit shall entitle the individual to use the title "polysomnographic technician" or "permit technician", or the initials "PSGT-E".

§2869. Individuals and practices not affected

(3) Any individual pursuing a course of study in an accredited CAAHEP polysomnographic technology education program for performing a polysomnography procedure or service, provided both of the following conditions are met:

(a) The polysomnographic procedure or service is within the individual's course of study.

(b) The polysomnography procedure or service is performed under the direct supervision of a physician or a registered polysomnographic technologist who is physically present in the area where such a polysomnographic procedure or service is being performed and is available to furnish assistance and direction throughout the polysomnography procedure or service.

§2870. Prohibitions

A. (1) ~~On or after January 1, 2006, no~~ No individual shall engage or attempt to engage in the practice of polysomnography or perform or attempt to perform polysomnograms, unless he holds a license issued by the Louisiana State Board of Medical Examiners in accordance with the provisions of this Chapter.

(10) Has engaged in dishonest or unethical practices in activity regulated under the provisions of this Part. The commissioner shall adopt rules and regulations in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act to illustrate examples of such practices providing grounds for suspension or revocation of registration. Such examples shall be for illustrative purposes only and shall not be deemed exclusive.

Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become effective on the day following such approval.

As to recreational products dealers, the repurchase of parts shall be limited to those listed in the manufacturer's price book. The motor vehicle, recreational product, and specialty vehicles and parts shall be repurchased at the cost to the licensee which shall include without limitation freight and advertising costs, less all allowances paid to the dealer, except that new automobiles shall be purchased on the schedule as follows:

* * *

(c) At fair market value, all special tools and automotive service equipment owned by the dealer which were recommended in writing and designated as special tools and equipment and purchased in the ordinary course of business from or purchased at the request of the manufacturer, converter, distributor, or representative, if the tools and equipment are in usable and good condition except for reasonable wear and tear. Fair market value shall be no less than cost of acquisition of special tools and automotive service equipment by the dealer.

* * *

(2) The manufacturer or converter shall make the required repurchase after the dealer terminates his franchise as follows:

(a) Within and within thirty days for motor and specialty specialty vehicle dealers and sixty days for recreational products dealers of the submission to it, by certified mail, return receipt requested, or commercial delivery service with verification of receipt, of a final inventory of motor vehicles, and parts, special tools, and automotive service equipment on hand.

(b) For motor vehicle dealers, after tender of the parts and special tools and automotive service equipment to the manufacturer.

B. Failure to make such repurchase without just cause shall subject the manufacturer or converter to a penalty of one and one-half percent per month, or fraction thereof, of the inventory value or returnable recreational product, specialty specialty and motor vehicles, and parts, signs, special tools, and automotive service equipment, payable to the dealer, as long as the repurchase is not made.
