RE: Line item vetoes of House Bill 122

Dear Speaker Barras and President Alario:

Pursuant to La. Const. Art. 4, Sec. 5(G), I have exercised my line veto item authority with regard to House Bill 122 for the following items:

Veto No. 1: The reduction to the Louisiana Stadium and Exposition District is excessive and would significantly impact its operations. This reduction will be modified by the Commissioner of Administration under the authority granted by Section 6 of this legislation.

Veto No. 2: The reduction to the Louisiana State Racing Commission is excessive and would significantly impact its operations. This reduction will be modified by the Commissioner of Administration under the authority granted by Section 6 of this legislation.

Veto No. 3: The reduction to the Louisiana State Police is excessive and would significantly impact its operations. This reduction will be modified by the Commissioner of Administration under the authority granted by Section 6 of this legislation.

Veto No. 4: The reduction to the Office of the Secretary of Culture, Recreation and Tourism is excessive and would significantly impact its operations.

Veto No. 5: This Section is inconsistent with the appropriation made to the Office of Motor Vehicles on page 10, lines 42-47 of this legislation.

I have further attached to this letter a copy of the final, signed version of House Bill 122.

AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 46:236.15(D)(1)(introductory paragraph) and (a), relative to child support enforcement; to provide relative to authority for seizures and intercepts by the Department of Children and Family Services; to provide for an administrative hearing process; and to provide for related matters.

(2) "Commissioner" shall mean means the commissioner of insurance.

(2)(3) "Department" shall mean means the Department of Insurance.

(3)(4) "Limited licensee" means a person or entity authorized to sell certain coverages relating to the rental of vehicles pursuant to the provisions of this Part.

(4) (5) "Rental agreement" means any written agreement setting forth the terms and conditions governing the use of a vehicle provided by the rental company for rental or lease.

(5) (6) "Rental company" means any person or entity in the business of providing primarily private passenger vehicles to the public under a rental agreement for a period not to exceed ninety days.

(6) (7) "Rental period" means the term of the rental agreement.

(7) (8) "Renter" means any person obtaining the use of a vehicle from a rental company under the terms of a rental agreement for a period not to exceed ninety days.

(8) (9) "Vehicle" or "rental vehicle" means a motor vehicle of the private passenger type including passenger vans, minivans, and sport utility vehicles, and of the cargo type including but not limited to cargo vans, pickup trucks and trucks with a gross vehicle weight of less than twenty-six thousand pounds and which do not require the operator to possess a commercial driver's license."
