SENATE BILL NO. 1—
BY SENATOR MORRELL

AN ACT

To amend and reenact Section 2 of Act No. 5 of the 2018 Second Extraordinary Session of the Legislature, relative to sales and use tax; to provide with respect to collection and remittance of

sales and use taxes; to provide for the effective date of the definition of dealer; and to provide for related matters.

The bill was read by title and referred by the President to the Committee on Revenue and Fiscal Affairs.
