"20-950 JUDGMENTS

Notwithstanding the provisions of R.S. 49:112, the sum of \$13,284,950.34 or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the State General Fund (Direct) for Fiscal Year 2021-2022 to be allocated to pay consent judgments and other final judgments against the state, Board of Tax Appeals recommendations for payment of a claim against the state, and reimbursements of attorney fees, all as provided in this Section. A judgment may only be paid from this appropriation if it is final. All judgments provided for in this Section shall be paid as to principal, interest, court costs, and expert witness fees as awarded in each judgment, it being the intent herein that when the provisions of a judgment conflict with the provisions of this Act, the provisions of the judgment shall be controlling. Any other provision of this Act not in conflict with the provisions of a judgment shall control. Payment shall be made as to each judgement, Board of Tax Appeals recommendation, or reimbursement for attorney fees only after presentation to the state treasurer of documentation required by the state treasurer. Further, all judgments provided for in this Section shall be deemed to have been paid on the effective date of the Act, and interest shall cease to run as of that date.

Monies in the fund shall be used for partial payment of the judgment captioned "Jean Boudreaux and the Victims of the Flood on April 6, 1983 on the Tangipahoa River versus the State of Louisiana, Department of Transportation, et al.", rendered on June 10, 2005, bearing Number 2004 CA 0985, on the docket of the Court of Appeal, First Circuit, state of Louisiana. The monies payable pursuant to this Section shall be paid to the plaintiffs through Hancock Bank, as escrow agent, into escrow account number 1097000229. Payment shall be made as to this judgment only after presentation to the state treasurer of documentation required by the state treasurer. Payments out of the fund shall not be made without prior approval of the compromise agreement by the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget."

D. Monies in the fund shall be distributed as follows: sixty million dollars shall be used for the Louisiana Tourism Revival Program as provided for in R.S. 39:100.55.2 and seventeen million five-hundred thousand dollars shall be appropriated to the Department of Culture, Recreation and Tourism for the Marketing Program.

§100.55.2. Louisiana Tourism Industry Revival Program

A. The Louisiana Tourism Industry Revival Program is established to provide grants to local and regional tourist commissions for marketing and promoting Louisiana as a tourism destination for in-state and out-of-state travel activity. The GOHSEP shall administer the program.

B. The division of administration shall establish a program portal in which applications shall be submitted and the division shall publish information on the program. The program portal page shall be operational no later than August 31, 2021.

C. In order to qualify to receive a grant award, the tourist commission must be formed and created pursuant to R.S. 33:4574.

D. The division of administration shall submit a plan for the administration and structure of the program to the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget by July 31, 2021 for review and approval at the monthly August meeting. No grants shall be awarded prior to Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget approving the plan submitted by the division of administration."

(2) The Commission shall be comprised of ten members, five members appointed by the President of the Senate and five members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives. A Senate member of the Commission and a House member of the Commission shall serve as co-chairmen of the Commission. A quorum of the Commission shall be six members.

C.(1) The Commission shall develop the guidance and recommendations for the distribution of grants from the Water Sector Fund, the monies in which fund were received by the state pursuant to the American Rescue Plan Act.

(2)(a) The Commission shall meet no later than July 14, 2021, to adopt the guidance, a recommendation process, and eligibility criteria for community water systems, community sewer systems, and local governing authorities to participate in the program. Such guidance, recommendations, and criteria shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

- (i) Application requirements;
- (ii) A time line for application submissions and approval;
- (iii) Criteria for ratings;
- (iv) A process for prioritizing critical infrastructure needs; and
- (v) Requirements for matching funds, waivers of matching funds or decreasing the match requirement.

(b) The guidance, recommendation process, and eligibility criteria shall be completed and published on the division of administration's program portal page in adequate time as to allow the program to commence no later than August 1, 2021.

D.(1) The Commission shall establish the direction and responsibilities of a working panel of professionals from the following offices: the office of public health in the Louisiana Department of Health, the office of community development in the division of administration, the office of facility planning and control in the division of administration, and the Department of Environmental Quality, hereinafter referred to as the "working panel".

(2) The office of facility planning and control and the division of administration shall be responsible for administering the program and establishing the program portal page in which applications shall be submitted.

(3) The Commission shall submit the adopted guidance, recommendations, and eligible criteria to the division of administration to be published on the program's portal page maintained by the division of administration. The program portal page shall be operational no later than August 1, 2021.

E.(1) The working panel shall assist the Subcommittee in its work and furnish such information, reports, aid, services, and assistance as may be requested by the Commission.

(2) The working panel shall review and rate applications submitted by community water systems, community sewer systems, and local governing authorities. The working panel shall make recommendations in accordance with the guidance established by the Commission.

(3) In recommending a process for prioritizing critical infrastructure needs, the working panel shall consider such factors as the condition of the system, the system's or local governing authority's available resources, and the other funding sources available to the system or local governing authority.

F. Interested participants shall apply through the division of administration's program portal page.

G. No later than seven business days after the program portal page receives applications, the working panel shall begin processing

and reviewing applications. All applications shall include the following, at a minimum:

- (1) The amount of grant funding requested.
- (2) The current condition of the system and the proposed use of the grant funding.
- (3) The amount and proposed source of funding for a required match.
- (4) Proposals for repairs, improvements, or consolidation with neighboring systems.
- (5) Proposals for ensuring the financial sustainability and compliance of the systems, including proposals for increasing rates paid by users of the system based on a fair assessment of the system to comparable systems.

H. The working panel shall make recommendations every fifteen days to the Commission. Recommendations to the Commission shall include:

(1) Recommendations for utilization of existing resources including the Drinking Water Revolving Loan Fund, Clean Water State Revolving Fund, and Community Water Enrichment and Other Improvements Fund.

(2) Certification that the local governing authority that operates the system either utilized funding received pursuant to the Coronavirus Local Fiscal Recovery Fund of the American Rescue Act Plan of 2021 as the source of funding for the required match or had legitimate cause that precluded the use of those funds for the match.

(3) The Commission shall make recommendations to the Committee every month until all funds are expended or obligated.

I. No money shall be expended from the program without the approval of the Committee.

J. The provisions of R.S. 39:72.1(A) shall not apply to monies appropriated from the fund pursuant to this Section.

K. If a community water system, community sewer system or a local governing authority has received or is on the list to receive a line of credit pursuant to the Act which originated as House Bill Number 2 of the 2021 Regular Session of the Legislature of Louisiana and, in accordance with the guidance, the project is eligible to receive funding through the Water Sector Program for the same project, the Commission may recommend to the commissioner of administration that the project not receive a line of credit in lieu of funding from the Water Sector Program."

**SENATE BILL NO. 101—
BY SENATOR ABRAHAM**

AN ACT
