Re: Line Item Vetoes in House Bill 1 of the 2021 Regular Session

Dear Speaker Schexnayder and President Cortez:

Please allow this letter to inform you that I have signed House Bill 1 of the 2021 Regular Session. However, I have exercised my line item veto authority granted to me to veto 8 items.

I have exercised my line item veto authority as follows:

- Veto No. 1: Delete Lines 16-19 on Page 4 of 230, beginning with the last sentence ("Any subsequent change . . ."): This language is unnecessary, as this oversight of the Personal Services expenditure categories is already performed by the Executive Branch. Further, this provision violates Article II, Section 2 of the Louisiana Constitution.
- Veto No. 2: Delete Lines 21-25 on Page 12 of 230: This language is unnecessary, as this information is already provided throughout the bill. Additionally, this oversight is afforded to the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget through the budget adjustment process.
- Veto No. 3: Delete Lines 26-30 on Page 12 of 230: This language is unnecessary, as this oversight of agency expenditures is already performed by the Executive Branch.
- Veto No. 4: Delete Lines 46-48 of Page 18 of 230: This amendment would reduce necessary funding for operating services and contractual obligations.

Veto No. 5: Deleted Lines 1-3 on Page 20 of 230: This language is unnecessary oversight of the Homeowners Assistance Fund program. Further, this provision violates Article II, Section 2 of the

Louisiana Constitution.

Veto No. 6 Delete Lines 23-35 on Page 88 of 230: The entities that are transferring the funds are in the best position to identify or verify the source of

their funds set for transfer, not the Department. Thus, the transferring entity is the entity which should certify as to the fact that the funds transferred are "public funds" pursuant to federal regulation. Further, this provision violates Article II, Section 2 of the Louisiana

Constitution.

Veto No. 7 Delete lines 12-13 on Page 197 of 230: This item contains an unnecessary appropriation.

Delete Lines 38-40 on Page 199 of 230: This Veto No. 8 item contains an unnecessary appropriation.

The prior fiscal year's actual total tax, licenses, and fees exceed the actual total tax, licenses, and fees for Fiscal Year 2018-2019, adjusted annually by the growth factor in Article VII, Section 10(C) of the Constitution of Louisiana.

If the applicable prescriptive period has expired, the additional tax paid by the taxpayer in the case of an underpayment or the refund or credit received by the taxpayer in the case of an overpayment shall be for the taxable year such tax was paid, such refund was received, or such credit was allowed, as the case may be.

(ii)(b) When a federal refund results from transactions or conditions which arise after the close of the taxable year for which the refund is made, such federal refund shall be taken into account, for purposes of this Part, for the taxable year in which arose the transactions or conditions causing the refund.

(c)(2) Taking federal adjustments into account. A payment of additional federal tax upon income which has borne Louisiana tax shall be taken into account by decreasing taxable income. That portion, if any, of such additional federal tax payment which would be disallowed as a deduction under either R.S. 47:287.81 or R.S. 47:287.83 shall be excluded from such adjustment. Refunds or credits of federal overpayments, including refunds or credits created by the carryback of a federal net operating loss, shall be taken into account by increasing Louisiana net income or decreasing the Louisiana net

loss, as the case may be. That portion, if any, of the federal refund or credit of an overpayment which has not previously been charged against or deducted from Louisiana net income shall be excluded from such adjustment.

The Department of Revenue may require the QMC or the investor to submit additional information as may be necessary to administer the provisions of this Section. Upon receipt of the tax credit certification letter and any necessary additional information, the secretary of the Department of Revenue shall make payment to the QMC or the investor in the amount to which he is entitled from the current collections of the taxes collected pursuant to Chapter 1 of Subtitle II of this Title, as amended.

(2) The provisions of this Subsection shall be applicable to Qualified Music Companies with applications received on or after July 1, 2021. Qualified Music Companies with applications received prior to July 1, 2021 shall continue to be applied and carried forward pursuant to the provisions of Subparagraph (C)(4)(b) of this Section.

- (10)(7) "Public counter" means a counter, tabulator, or other device on the outside or on the face of the machine, which shall at all times indicate the number of times votes have been east on a machine at an election. protective device that shall incrementally record and indicate each time votes have been east on a machine during an election.
- (11) (8) "Question" means an amendment, proposition, or like matter to be voted on in an election.
- (9) "Vote-capture device" means a component of the voting system, including hardware which may include a voter-facing scanner, software, and firmware, that captures and counts voter ballot selections.

 (12) (10) "Vote indicator" means the device on a voting
- (12) (10) "Vote indicator" means the device on a voting machine with which votes upon a candidate or question are indicated.
- (11) "Voter-facing scanner" means a vote-capture device used for in-person voting that captures a voter's selections on a secure paper ballot one sheet at a time, whether hand-marked or produced by a ballot-marking device.
- (12) "Voter-verified paper record" means a paper document or a secure hand-marked paper ballot produced by a voting system that the voter can review and verify before officially casting his ballot. The voter-verified paper record shall be printed on individual sheets of paper for each voter and shall not be printed on a continuous paper roll. The voter-verified paper record shall be independent of any software or electronic device and temporarily available to the voter for verification prior to casting his ballot upon the vote capture device.
- (13) "Voting machine" means the enclosure occupied by the voter when voting, as formed by the machine voter-facing vote-capture device, including its screen and privacy shield, which shall include electronic voting machines. Tabulation of the vote may occur on the voting machine or on another component of the voting system.

- B. The division of administration shall establish a program portal in which applications shall be submitted, and the division shall publish information on the program. The program portal page shall be operational no later than August 31, 2021.
- C. In order to qualify to receive a grant award, the recipient shall be an official tourism commission, convention and visitors bureau, or official destination marketing organization.
- D. The division of administration shall submit a plan for the administration and structure of the program to the Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget by July 31, 2021, for review and approval at the monthly August meeting. No grants shall be awarded prior to Joint Legislative Committee on the Budget approving the plan submitted by the division of administration.
- E.
