In the event a surplus is projected, the department shall provide an explanation of the source of any surplus revenues and the rationale of the department's proposed use of the means of financing. In the event a deficit is projected due to the budgeted means of finance or estimated revenue collections being insufficient to finance projected expenditures, the department shall inform the committee of any other sources of revenues that may be available or adjustments in expenditures that could be implemented within the department to aid in alleviating the projected deficit. Also beginning with the second report and continuing in each report submitted monthly thereafter, the department shall delineate, in the same manner as presented in the first report of the fiscal year, the initial allocation of payments, total

The office of economic development shall have forty-five days from the date the proposal is received to review the payment in lieu of tax proposal, pursuant to those standards herein and any additional requirements which may be adopted by the office of economic development, and transmit a recommendation of approval or denial to the New Orleans city council, through the clerk of the city council. The city council shall have fifteen days from the date the proposal is received by its clerk to review the payment in lieu of tax proposal, followed by an additional thirty-day period to adopt a resolution disapproving or approving, with or without amendments, the proposal. The thirty day approval period shall include a hearing before the city council economic development committee, which may recommend a vote of disapproval, approval, or approval with amendments on the resolution to the full city council. The payment in lieu of tax agreement shall be deemed denied for execution by the district or any subdistrict if the city council fails to adopt a resolution approving the proposal, with or without amendments, within the thirty days following such fifteen-day review period. The payment in lieu of tax agreement related to an economic development project within the district or any subdistrict shall become effective upon approval by resolution of the board of the district or any subdistrict after the payment in lieu of tax agreement has received the approval of the city council and has incorporated the city council amendments, if any, to the payment in lieu of tax agreement.

(3) At the time of any delivery of any vapor products, electronic cigarettes, or alternative nicotine products purchased online, a thirdparty delivery agent shall obtain the recipient's signature and verify the age of the recipient through the use of a real-time electronic age verification device that shall be approved by the commissioner and such device shall be capable of the following:

(a) Verifying proof of age through authoritative digitized

identification card technology.

(b) Reading a valid state-issued driver's license, a valid state issued identification card, a valid military identification card, or a valid passport.

(c) Storing the recipient's name, age, date of birth, the expiration date of the identification, and the date and time that the identification

was scanned.

(4) The third party's delivery agent shall refuse delivery and return the vapor products, electronic cigarettes, or alternative nicotine products to the manufacturer if any of the following occur:

(a) The recipient does not produce a valid and current form of identification as provided in this Section.

(b) There is reason to doubt the authenticity or correctness of the recipient's identification.

(c) The recipient refuses to sign for the receipt of the delivery.

(5) Any violation of this Subsection shall result in a fine of five hundred dollars per offense.
