(5) ~~One person appointed by the governor from a list of three persons submitted by the Louisiana Independent Oil and Gas Association who shall serve an initial term of four years.~~

(6) ~~One person appointed by the governor from a list of three persons submitted by the Louisiana Independent Oil and Gas Association who shall serve an initial term of two years.~~

(7) ~~One person appointed by the governor from a list of three persons submitted by the Louisiana Landowners Association who shall serve an initial term of three years.~~

(8) ~~One person appointed by the governor from a list of three persons submitted by representatives of the Louisiana division of the Sierra Club, the Louisiana Wildlife Federation, and the Louisiana division of the Audubon Society, who shall serve an initial term of three years.~~

(9) ~~One person appointed by the governor from a list of three persons submitted by the Nature Conservancy for an initial term of three years.~~

(10) ~~The assistant secretary for the office of conservation or his designee shall serve as vice chairman of the commission. The assistant secretary shall not be counted to determine the number needed to constitute a quorum but shall be counted to establish a quorum. When the secretary is present, the assistant secretary shall not be a voting member. The Department of Energy and Natural~~

Resources shall adopt rules and regulations, in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, to implement the provisions of this Part and to provide for procedures for site assessments and restoration."

(3) R.S. 46:1846 to prohibit communications between offenders and victims following a charge or after sentencing for any crime of violence.

(4) R.S. 15:574.4.2(A)(5) as condition of a parole release that requires that the parolee stay away from any specific person.

K. The provisions of this Section shall not apply to child custody proceedings or proceedings pursuant to the Domestic Violence Prevention Firearm Transfer Act, Code of Criminal Procedure Article 1001 et seq.

L. The provisions of this Section shall not apply to proceedings for writs of habeas corpus for the determination and enforcement of rights to the custody of a minor or for the release of a person in custody in which the family court has original jurisdiction."
