(d) A mandatory reporter who is a police officer or law enforcement official may submit reports directly to the Department of Children and Family Services through a secure web based platform. The secure web based platform may utilize prompts or other methods to assist the person completing the report to provide information pursuant to Paragraph (B) of this Article as well as information deemed relevant or important. The Department of Children and Family Services shall not refuse to receive, log, or process a report submitted via the secure web based platform.

(i) A law enforcement agency may authorize its employees to create or transmit reports required by this Article through a secure web based platform designated by the agency. An agency may only designate one secure web based platform for its employees to use to create or transmit the reports, and the agency may designate a secure web based platform only if the following conditions are met:

(aa) The secure web based platform functions in compliance with applicable federal law.

(ii) Any dues or membership fees of any membership organization or corporation made by its members or stockholders, if such membership organization or corporation is not organized primarily for the purpose of supporting, opposing or otherwise influencing the nomination for election, or election, of any person to public office making expenditures for electioneering communications. However, any funds of such an organization or corporation used for the purpose of contributions to candidates or committees or to publicly advocate support or defeat of a candidate or for expenditures as defined in this Chapter expenditures for electioneering communications shall be reportable and all contributions made by such membership organization or corporation which are otherwise reportable under the provisions of this Chapter shall be reported.

(8) "Coordinated expenditure" means an expenditure made by any person individual, leadership committee, or political committee in cooperation, consultation, or concert with, or at the request or

suggestion of, a candidate, his principal campaign committee or a subsidiary committee thereof, or their agents for the purpose of supporting, opposing, or otherwise influencing the nomination or election of the candidate of expenditures for electioneering communications.

(11)(a) "Expenditure" means a purchase, payment, advance, deposit, or gift, of money or anything of value made for a purpose provided for in R.S. 18:1501.1(A) or 1505.2(1) by a committee or for an electioneering communication.

(d) "Expenditure" shall not include:

(ii) Any communication, including an electioneering communication, by any membership organization or business entity to its employees, members, directors, or stockholders, or their family members, if such membership organization or business entity is not organized primarily for the purpose of supporting, opposing, or otherwise influencing the nomination for election, or election, of any person to public office or for the purpose of supporting or opposing a proposition or question to be submitted to the voters making electioneering communications. All other expenditures made by such membership organization or business entity which are otherwise reportable under the provisions of this Chapter shall be reported. For purposes of this definition, business entity means any proprietorship, partnership, corporation, or other legal entity, including their subsidiaries.

§1491.7. Reports; contents

B. Each report required to be in conformity with this Section shall contain the following information:

- (i) Appear on the principal display panel.
(ii) Be in a font size not less than thirty-point type.
(iii) Be in a typeface and color that contrast with the background.
(iv) Be placed in close proximity to the product name."

The remedies established in this Chapter are nonexclusive and may be pursued independently of each other and in addition to other remedies provided by law. In order for the lien and privilege to arise, the order, judgment, notice of judgment, or lien shall be final and not subject to appeal when recorded in the mortgage office. The lien and privilege shall have ranking as provided by R.S. 9:4821(A)(1).

C. Any liens placed against such immovable property shall be included in the next annual ad valorem tax bill and shall be paid along with such taxes, subject, however, to any valid homestead exemption. Failure to pay the liens shall cause the immovable property in or on which the violation occurred to be subject to the same provisions of law that govern tax sales of immovable property when the immovable property has been declared blighted or a public nuisance by an administrative hearing officer acting in accordance with this Section. The property owners and other parties having interests in the property shall not have a right of redemption. However, if the immovable property has been sold for nonpayment of taxes to a tax sale purchaser other than the municipality, and if the right of redemption from the tax sale has not elapsed at least one year

prior to the sale pursuant to this Section, the tax sale purchaser shall have a right of redemption from the sale pursuant to this Section until one year after the right of redemption from the tax sale elapses. In addition, failure to pay the liens shall also cause such liens and privileges to be subject to enforcement in accordance with R.S. 13:2576. Any liens placed against immovable property that has a legal homestead exemption from taxes will become payable ninety days after the death of the owner thereof or immediately upon recordation of any conventional mortgage on the immovable property or transfer of title to a new owner, whichever occurs first."

(2) Payments for law enforcement officers and firemen survivor and disability benefits and extraordinary medical and dental expenses as provided for in R.S. 40:1665(C), 1665.2(C), and 1668, and 1668.1 shall be made by the office of risk management on behalf of the Law Enforcement Officers and Firemen's Survivor Benefit Review Board as a result of a specific appropriation received for that purpose.
