§ 1604.2. Insufficient funds check in payment of taxes; penalty

A. In the event a check used to make payment of a tax, interest, penalty, or fee due under this Subtitle is returned unpaid by the bank on which it is drawn for any reason related to the account on which the check is written, such shall constitute a failure to pay the tax, interest, penalty, or fee due and a specific penalty shall be imposed on the taxpayer in addition to all other penalties provided by law; provided however that, upon sufficient proof being furnished to the secretary by the bank that the bank was at fault for the nonpayment of the check, the secretary shall waive the penalty provided for in this Section Subsection. This specific penalty shall be an obligation to be collected and accounted for in the same manner as if it were part of the tax, interest, penalty, or fee that is due in payment of which the check was given and may be enforced in a separate action or in any action instituted for the collection of the tax, interest, penalty, or fee. The specific penalty imposed under this Section Subsection shall be an amount equal to the greater of one percent of the check or twenty dollars. After receipt of three insufficient fund checks during any twoyear period, the secretary of the Department of Revenue may require payment of the taxes, interest, penalties, or fees due by the taxpayer to be paid by certified check, money order, or cash.

R.S. 47:1604.2(B) is all proposed new law.

B. In addition to the penalty set forth in Subsection (A) of this Section, it shall be presumptive evidence of the taxpayer's intent to defraud the state and a penalty of fifty percent shall be imposed if a check, draft, or order for the payment of money upon any bank or other depository issued as payment of any tax due is returned unpaid by the bank or other depository and the taxpayer knows at the time of the issuance of the check, draft, or order that there is not sufficient credit with the bank or other depository for the payment in full of the instrument upon its presentation, provided that:

(1) A notice that the instrument was returned unpaid shall be mailed to the taxpayer at the address given in the last report filed by said taxpayer, or to any address obtainable from any private entity which will provide such address free of charge or from any federal, state, or local

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government entity, including but not limited to the United States Postal Service or from United States Postal Service certified software and the taxpayer does not make payment within fifteen days of the mailing of the notice.

(2) If payment is not made within fifteen days of the notice mailed under Paragraph (B)(1) of this Subsection, the notice shall be mailed by certified mail in the United States mail system to the taxpayer at the address given in the last report filed by the taxpayer, or to any address obtainable from any private entity which will provide such address free of charge or from any federal, state, or local government entity, including but not limited to the United States Postal Service or from United States Postal Service certified software or shall be delivered or personally tendered on the taxpayer. If payment is not made within fifteen days of the certified mail notice or fifteen days after the delivery or personal tender of the notice the presumption shall apply and the penalty shall be imposed."

Notwithstanding the provisions of the preceding subsections, the addition to the tax penalty imposed with respect to any underpayment of any installment shall not be imposed if the total amount of all payments of estimated tax made on or before the last date prescribed for payment of such installment equals or exceeds the amount which would have been required to be paid on or before such date if the estimated tax were whichever of the following is the lesser:

G. Excessive adjustment under R.S. 47:120.2.

(1) Addition to tax. If the amount of an adjustment under R.S. 47:120.2 made before the 15th fifteenth day of the fourth month following the close of the taxable year is excessive there shall be added to the tax under this Chapter for the taxable year an amount determined at the rate a penalty of twelve percent per annum upon the excessive amount from the date on which the credit is allowed or the refund is paid to such 15th fifteenth day.
