AN ACT

To amend and reenact R.S. 47:463.61, relative to motor vehicles; to provide relative to the "Choose Life" prestige license plate; to provide for the design and color of such plate; to provide relative to the fee for such plate; to provide relative to the use of such fees; to repeal provisions relative to the Choose Life Advisory Council; to repeal provisions relative to the membership, terms, duties, and pay for members of such council; to repeal requirement that qualified organizations submit annual audits; to prohibit qualified organizations from disclosing certain information; and to provide for related matters.

AMENDMENT NO. 5

On page 5, between lines 22 and 23, insert the following:

§463.83. Special prestige license plates; Choose Choice; fund A. The secretary of the Department of Public Safety and Corrections shall establish a special prestige license plate to be known as the Choose Choice plate, provided there are a minimum of one hundred applicants for such plate. The license plate shall be

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restricted to passenger cars, pickup trucks, vans, and recreational vehicles. The design of such plate shall include a logo depicting a woman holding an American flag and a Louisiana flag and shall bear the words "Choose Choice", and shall comply with R.S. 47:463(A)(3).

- B. The prestige license plate shall be issued, upon application, to any citizen of Louisiana in the same manner as any other motor vehicle license plate.
- C. The annual fee for this special prestige license plate shall be twenty-five dollars, in addition to the regular motor vehicle license fee provided in R.S. 47:463, to be distributed in the manner set forth in Subsection E of this Section, and a three dollar and fifty cent handling fee to be retained by the department to offset a portion of administrative costs.
- D. The department shall collect the fee for the prestige license plate and forward the fee to the state treasurer for immediate deposit in the state treasury.
- E.(1) After compliance with the requirements of Article VII, Section 9(B) of the Constitution of Louisiana relative to the Bond Security and Redemption Fund, an amount equal to the monies received by the state treasury pursuant to provisions of Subsection D of this Section shall be deposited into the Choose Choice Fund, which is hereby created as a special fund in the state treasury and hereafter referred to as the "fund". All unexpended and unencumbered monies in the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall remain in the fund. Monies in the fund shall be invested by the state treasurer in the same manner as monies in the state general fund, and interest earned on the investment of such monies shall be deposited into the fund. Monies in the fund shall be withdrawn only pursuant to an appropriation by the legislature solely for the purposes provided by this Section.
- (2) An organization wishing to qualify for receipt of funds shall submit an affidavit affirming its qualifications, which shall include a pledge to spend the money in accordance with the provisions of this Section, to the treasurer and shall qualify as tax exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, as amended. Furthermore, an organization wishing to qualify for receipt of funds shall demonstrate it provides counseling and other services intended to meet the needs of pregnant women.
- (3) Organizations receiving monies under this Section shall use such funds to provide for the material needs of pregnant women, including but not limited to providing clothing, housing, medical care, food, utilities, and transportation. The remaining funds may be used for family planning counseling, job training, and other related matters.
- F. The state treasurer shall annually disburse from the fund an equal amount to each of the qualifying organizations and shall make available, upon request, the name and the amount of monies disbursed to each organization. However, no organization receiving funds according to the provisions of this Section shall be required to disclose the name of any individual receiving money from such organization. The state treasurer shall review the distribution and expenditure of funds under this Section at least once every three years to ensure funds are disbursed and expended in accordance with the provisions of this Section.
- G. The secretary may establish rules and regulations to implement the provisions of this Section, including but not limited to rules and regulations governing the collection and disbursement of fees, the transfer and disposition of such license plates, the colors available, and the design criteria."

- (3) All licenses issued under the provisions of this Chapter for motor vehicle dealers, motor vehicle salesmen/agents, motor vehicle lessors, and used motor vehicle dealers in accordance with the geographical location of the licensee shall be for two years beginning and ending as follows:
- (a) 1st Commission District April 1 through March 31, beginning and ending in odd years.
- (b) 2nd Commission District May 1 through April 30, beginning and ending in even years.
- (c) 3rd Commission District June 1 through May 31, beginning and ending in odd years.
- (d) 4th Commission District July 1 through June 30, beginning and ending in even years.
- (e) 5th Commission District August 1 through July 31, beginning and ending in odd years.
- (f) 6th Commission District September 1 through August 31, beginning and ending in even years.
- (g) 7th Commission District October 1 through September 30, beginning and ending in odd years.

- (2) (ii) The members of the board initially appointed by the mayor shall be appointed as follows: two members for one year each, two members for two years each, two members for three years each, two members for four years each, and one member for five years, the length of the term for each individual appointed to be determined by lot. They shall serve until their successors have been appointed and qualified.
- (iii) The members of the board thereafter appointed by the mayor upon the expiration of the respective terms of the initial appointees shall be selected and appointed in accordance with the procedures herein prescribed for the selection and appointment of the original members for the term of five years. However, vacancies shall be filled from nominations submitted by the central area council of the chamber of commerce of the New Orleans area New Orleans Area Council of the New Orleans Regional Chamber of Commerce in the following manner. The mayor shall select and appoint one of two names submitted to him by the central area such council for each of the five vacancies for which the council is to submit nominees. If the selection and appointment by the mayor does not take place within

thirty days following submission of the nominees by the central area council, New Orleans Area Council of the New Orleans Regional Chamber of Commerce, the selection and appointment shall be made by the city council. Any vacancy which occurs prior to the expiration of the term for which a member of the board has been appointed shall be filled in accordance with the procedures as set forth herein. However, the New Orleans Area Council of the New Orleans Regional Chamber of Commerce may submit additional nominees to either the mayor or the city council, as applicable, until all vacancies pursuant to this Subsection are filled.

- (iv) All claims made by the dealer for compensation under this Subparagraph shall be paid within thirty days after approval and shall be approved or disapproved within thirty days after receipt. When any claim is disapproved, the dealer shall be notified in writing of the grounds for disapproval.
- (y) No claim which has been approved and paid may be charged back to the dealer unless it can be shown that one or all of the following applies:

the (aa) The claim was false or fraudulent,.

that the (bb) The repairs were not properly made.

or (cc) The repairs were unnecessary to correct a the defective condition under generally accepted standards of workmanship,

or that the (dd) The dealer failed to reasonably substantiate or properly submit the claim the repair in accordance with reasonable written requirements of the manufacturer or distributor, if the dealer was notified of the requirements prior to the time the claim arose and if the requirements were in effect at the time the claim arose. However, a manufacturer or distributor shall not deny a claim solely based on a motor vehicle dealer's incidental failure to comply with a specific claim processing requirement, or a clerical error, or other administrative technicality.

* * *

(r) To fail or refuse to sell or offer to sell to all motor vehicle franchisees in a line make, every motor vehicle sold or offered for sale under a franchise to any motor vehicle franchisee of the same line make; or to unreasonably require a motor vehicle dealer to pay an extra fee, purchase unreasonable advertising displays or any other materials, or to remodel, renovate, or recondition its existing facilities as a prerequisite to receiving a certain model or series of vehicles. However, the failure to deliver any such motor vehicle shall not be

considered a violation of this Section if the failure is not arbitrary and is due to a lack of manufacturing capacity or to a strike or labor difficulty, a shortage of materials, a freight embargo or other cause of which the franchisor has no control.

(t) * * *

(ii) To attempt to coerce, or coerce, compliance with facilities requirements that include any requirements that a motor vehicle dealer establish or maintain exclusive office, parts, service or body shop facilities, when unless such requirements would be unreasonable, considering current economic conditions, reasonable and are not otherwise justified by reasonable business considerations. The burden of proving that such requirements are unreasonable, considering current economic conditions, reasonable and are not otherwise justified by reasonable business considerations is on the dealer manufacturer. If the franchise agreement of the manufacturer or distributor for facility uses or modifications, the manufacturer or distributor will shall approve or disapprove such a request in writing within sixty days of receipt of such request.

§1254.1. Audits of dealer records

- A. Notwithstanding the terms of any franchise agreement, warranty; and sales incentive audits of dealer records may be conducted by the manufacturer, distributor, distributor branch, or factory branch. Any audit for warranty parts or service compensation shall be for the twelve-month period immediately following the date of the payment of the claim by the manufacturer or distributor. However, a dealer shall not be held liable by virtue of an audit for failure to retain parts for a period in excess of six months. Any audit for sales incentives, service incentives, rebates, or other forms of incentive compensation shall only be for the eighteen-month twelve-month period immediately following the date of the payment of the claim by the manufacturer or distributor close of the promotion, event, program, or activity.

No claim which has been approved and paid may be charged back to the dealer unless it can be shown that the claim was false or fraudulent, that the repairs were not properly made, or the repairs were unnecessary to correct the defective condition under generally accepted standards of workmanship, or that the dealer failed to reasonably substantiate the repair in accordance with reasonable written requirements of the manufacturer or distributor, if the dealer has been notified of the requirements prior to the time the claim arose and if the requirements were in effect at the time the claim arose.
- C. A manufacturer or distributor shall not deny a claim solely based on a motor vehicle dealer's incidental failure to comply with a specific claim processing requirement, that results in or a clerical error, or other administrative technicality.

§1256.1. B.(1) Buyer's identification cards to bid or buy motor vehicles at salvage pools, salvage disposal sales, or through insurance companies shall be available to any person, business, or corporation, or licensed employee thereof, possessing a valid used motor vehicle dealer license, or a valid automotive dismantlers and recyclers license. Buyer's identification cards to bid or buy salvage shall be issued by the commission on a form prescribed by it and shall contain as a minimum the name, address, driver's license number, any one of the aforementioned dealers' license numbers, physical description, and signature of the applicant and the name and address of the employer of the applicant. Unless otherwise prohibited by rule or regulation of the commission and notwithstanding any other provisions of law to the contrary, a used motor vehicle dealer operating a salvage pool may accept bids from and make sales to any person eligible for a buyer's card who completes the commission's form and pays the appropriate fee to the salvage pool operator at the time and site of the sale, provided such fees and forms are remitted to the commission within five days; this authorization shall be valid for the date of the sale only and shall be utilized not more than once annually unless the commission thereafter approves the issuance of a buyer's identification card for that person.

C. It shall be the duty of the owner, manager, or person in charge of any salvage pool or salvage disposal sale, to prohibit the bidding by any person who does not display a buyer's identification card, to refuse to sell to any person any wrecked or repairable motor vehicle if such person does not display a valid buyer's identification card and to prohibit any person without a buyer's identification card to be present at the bidding site during a sale. Each buyer's identification card holder may be accompanied by a mechanic or other technical expert of his choice.

(F) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the commission may adopt rules and regulations which:

(1) Authorize, in lieu of a buyer's identification card, the imposition by each used motor vehicle dealer operating a salvage pool of a recordation charge per sale of each salvage vehicle to any person possessing a license as a used motor vehicle dealer or automotive dismantler or part recycler;

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(2) Establish the maximum aggregate annual amounts of such fees per buyer;

(3) Provide for the submission by each used motor vehicle dealer operating a salvage pool of monthly transaction reports of such sales and the remittance of such recordation charges to the commission; and

(4) Facilitate the implementation of this Subsection.

The forfeiture shall take effect no less than twenty days after notice is sent to the elected official pursuant to paragraph (2) of this Subsection.

(2) The supervisory committee shall notify the elected official in writing when he is subject to the forfeiture provided for in this Subsection. The notice shall provide the name of the elected official, the office he holds, the amount of the outstanding fines, fees, or penalties which are subject to forfeiture, and the date on which the forfeiture is to take effect. The supervisory committee shall send two copies of the notice by certified mail, one to the campaign address of the elected official on file with the supervisory committee and the other to the official address of the office which he holds. Additionally, the supervisory committee shall send a copy of the notice by certified mail to the entity which is responsible for disbursing the elected official's salary, along with instructions as to the proper method for forwarding the forfeited funds.

(3)(a) "Forfeiture" pursuant to this Subsection shall be an alternative means of collecting an outstanding fine, fee, or penalty imposed by a final order of a court or the supervisory committee pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter and against which all appeal delays have lapsed.

(b) On the next payroll date following the effective date of the forfeiture, and each payroll date thereafter so long as the forfeiture remains in effect, the entity which is responsible for disbursing the elected official's salary shall withhold that portion of the elected official's salary which is not exempt from seizure, as provided in R.S. 13:3881. This portion of the elected official's salary shall be forwarded to the supervisory committee, as directed in the notice. The forfeiture shall remain in effect until such time as the supervisory committee notifies the entity which is responsible for disbursing the elected official's salary that the elected official has complied with the order.

(c) The entity which is responsible for disbursing the elected official's salary may withhold three dollars from the nonexempt portion of the elected official's salary for each pay period during which the forfeiture is in effect to cover the administrative costs of the forfeiture.

(4) The supervisory committee shall treat all sums forwarded to it under this Subsection as payments by the elected official of the outstanding fines fees or penalties and shall immediately notify the

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entity which is responsible for disbursing the elected official's salary when the elected official has complied with the order or when the fines, fees, and penalties have been paid in full from the forfeited funds.

(5) For the purposes of this Subsection, an elected official shall be deemed to have complied with a final order upon paying the fine, fee, or penalty in full or upon entering into and remaining current on an agreement with the supervisory committee providing for a payment schedule. The failure to remain current on a payment schedule shall subject the elected official to forfeiture."
