(iv) The physical therapist has a doctorate in physical therapy and residency or fellowship training.

(v) The physical therapist has five years of clinical practice experience.

(b) A physical therapist who provides treatment pursuant to this Paragraph shall provide notice to the appropriate healthcare provider within fifteen calendar days of implementing physical therapy treatment. If, after thirty calendar days of implementing physical therapy treatment, the patient has not made measurable or functional improvement, the physical therapist shall refer the patient to an appropriate healthcare provider. The board shall take appropriate disciplinary action against any physical therapist who fails to refer a patient pursuant to this Paragraph.

§3087.206. Open meetings; requirements for posting to parish government website

A. All board meetings shall be conducted pursuant to the open meetings law.

B. Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, notice of all meetings of the board of commissioners shall be posted on the website maintained by the parish governing authority of Washington Parish no later than seventy-two hours prior to the meeting."

The office of facility planning and control shall provide a report of all suspended non-state projects to the Joint Legislative Committee on Capital Outlay on or before December 1, 2016. If a suspended project is not approved by the Joint Legislative Committee on Capital Outlay on or before the first day of February, any executed cooperative endeavor agreement for that project will be terminated. Nothing in this Section shall limit the applicability of the exceptions to the local match requirement provided for in R.S. 39:112(E)(2).

Notwithstanding any contrary provision of this Act or any contrary provision of law, the office of facility planning and control shall not execute a cooperative endeavor agreement with a non-state entity until documentation is received that indicates either that the local match is available or that no local match is required. This documentation shall include, but is not limited to a certified financial statement of the non-state entity. Further, the office of facility planning and control shall not execute a cooperative endeavor agreement for any non-state project receiving only a Priority 5 general obligation bond appropriation and a non-cash line of credit. If a non-state entity attempts to obligate any funds to be reimbursed by the state without a fully executed cooperative endeavor agreement, the provisions of R.S. 39:122(B)(2) shall apply."
